Davidson Field In Crockett Gets Fifth Producer

The Davidson Ranch multipay field of Crockett County gained its fifth 7,890-foot Pennsylvanian producer and a 7/8-mile southeast extension to that pay with completion of Texaco, Inc. No. 2-1 C. E. Davidson Jr. six miles southeast of Ozona, for a calculated, absolute open flow of 5,940 million cubic feet of gas daily, with gas-liquid ratio of 47, 169-1. Gravity of the condensate was 55, 2.

Production was through perforations at 7,836-914 feet, which had been fractured with 40,000 gallons and 146,000 pounds of sand.

Drilled to 8, 100 feet, operator set 41-inch casing at total depth and plugged back to 8,068 feet.

Parents in the community whose children are receiving no formal religious education are encouraged to enroll their children.

The plans call for a new cell block, containing one large cell separated from the other cells which may be used for women prisoners or juveniles, a transit cell, two cells within a run for felony prisoners, a drunk tank and a padded cell, plus a receiving room, office and vault, this to be built north of and attached to the existing structure. An entrance into the new part of the jail will be made from the room which leads to the tower in the old jail. New kitchen facilities will be built, along with rest rooms and storage space on the east part of the existing jail.

Entrance to the receiving and booking room will be made from the east at the end of a ramp which will exit behind the Baptist church annex.

Plans for a new jail or extensive remodeling of the present structure have been liscussed by officials for years however, after one successful and two attempted jailbreaks in less than three months, a descision had to be made by county officials.

The last attempted break which occurred Monday was discovered by Sheriff Billy Mills just before the final push on the outside rock wall. The two prisoners, who made the attempt, had only been locked up for about an hour. Evidently, when they managed to get a rock near the bottom of the window loose from the plaster, the wall around the window tumbled to the floor. exposing enough of the outside wall to allow a small army to get out, once the rocks on the outside were pushed out

The first break occurred about three months ago when an enterprising young prisoner used a metal bed slat to scrape away crumbling plaster making a good sized hole in the inside wall and then neatly scraped the mortar from around a rock in the outside wall and pushed it out along with several other large rocks. He escaped and was not apprehended until that night in function.

The second attempted break was foiled when Mrs. Mills kept hearing noises from the cell block above her apartment and suggested that the sheriff investigate. He found a large hole in the inside wall.

If the proposal passes the part of the jail which now houses prisoners would be remodeled and used for juvenile offenders or female violators.

The proposed bond issue, if approved, would be for a term of ten years. An anticipated drop in the state rate this year of 5 cents on the \$100 will offset the small increase (estimated at 4 cents) necessary to retire the bonds, making for no increase in taxes next year.


