



Most of us long for an "old-time" Christmas. And just what do we mean by an "old-time" Christmas? Let's dig back into the past, to remember how it was, for some of the


The nation was not as wealthy in the past as today. In fact, if we go back a few decades, many families were hard pressed to earn enough to pay the rent and buy sufficient food and clothes to keep going.





Dry Christmas Trees A Fire Hazard

bol of the beauty and joy of Christmas, But a dry tree is a fire hazard that can endanger the holiday season.

trees must be cut well in advance of use. However, prolonged storage in itself may not constitute a hazard. Trees dry much more slowly in outdoor unheated storage than in the dry, warm air in your home, points out Wayne Keese, agricultural engineer for the Texas

Agricultural Extension Service. "A Christmas tree, installed reasonably fresh, with its base immersed in water will remain safe from ignition from a point source, such as a match, for at least three weeks, " says Keese. "On the other hand, trees with prior outdoor storage may become flammable to matches within three to eight days if brought indoors and left dry. "

The Texas A&M University System specialist offers some pointers to help assure a firesafe Christmas in your home:

1. Buy your tree early so that you can be selective and purchase a reasonably fresh one. Check the tree for signs of needle shedding and brittleness which are signs that the tree has become too dry.

Store the tree outdoors, in the shade, with the base im mersed in water. When the tree is brought indoors, saw off the base with a diagonal cut at least one inch above the original cut. Put the tree in a stand with the base of the tree in

3. Locate the tree away from sources of heat, such as a fireplace or heating unit, and where it won't block exits.

4. Check the water level daily. The tree may use as much as a pint of water each

5. Keep your lighting system in good condition, inspect lighting strings and discard those with frayed or cracked insulation, broken sockets and loose connections. Buy replacements carrying the Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc. (UL)

6. Use flame-retardant or non-combustible decorating materials, such as glass, metal or asbestos. Remove combustible Christmas wrappings as soon as possible and place them in

metal tree. To avoid possible electric shock, use only indi-

built-in lighting system, it should carry the UL label.

8. Do not use lighted candles on a tree or near natural Most commercial Christmas evergreens and polystyrene foam

"Home fires increase in December and many result from carelessness with Christmas







Since machine needles break often when sewing these fabrics, keep extras on hand. Use a soft cloth--such as china silk -- to underline the fabric. Stitch fabric and underlining together, and remove heads and sequins inside seam allowances.

To press, use a dry iron at a low setting. Work lightly on the wrong side of the fabric. When adding beaded or sequined trim to a garment, apply it by hand. This means the trim is easily removed for cleaning, and the garment can be used after the holidays.

"Good selections include the Aleppo pine, Japanese black pine, Japanese yew, Loblolly pine, Deodar cedar, juniper or any other coniferous evergreen. If a broadleaf tree is preferred, use an American holly, Burford

holly, Dahoon holly or yaupon. If you want a tubbed plant suitable for interior landscaping, select a Norfolk Island pine, kumquat, calamondin or yew.

"If a balled-and-burlapped tree is selected, place it in a container large enough to allow at least an inch of peat moss, potting soil or compost around the soil ball. This prevents drying of the soil around the roots. The burlap can remain intact. With a container-grown tree, simply dress up the container. All containers should have drainage so that excess moisture can escape. Place the it's required by bones, aids in container in a large pan or tray blood clotting and keeps the

to catch the moisture. "Locate the tree away from a stove, radiator or fireplace or away from the air stream of your heating system. Keep the room as cool as possible.

"Plant the tree into the landscape as soon as possible after Christmas. Dig a hole large enough to allow three to four inches of soil around the ball. Set the tree at the same depth it was growing at the nursery or in the container. The backfill should include one part of peat moss and two parts of soil. Water the tree thoroughly before the hole is completely

"Continue to water the tree regularly and thoroughly but allow the soil to become a little dry between waterings. Mulch the soil surface around the tree with wood shavings, pine bark, peat moss or other organic matter to reduce weed growth and to conserve moisture. Wait until June or July before applying fertilizer so that the tree has time to become established
