





The winds of change blow strongly throughout much of the world and they do not blow in the direction of freedom or particularly the penal code democracy. It is the communist camp which pops the champagne provisions which cast a legal corks and toasts the new order.

The worry in the U.S. and its NATO allies runs very deep at this hour.

Sad to say, the U.S. probably speaks truly when it says it had no role in the recent events in Portugal. Even if we wished to help those Portuguese who do not want to see their country slip behind the iron curtain, we could not, since the CIA has been so badly crippled by the attacks of its domestic opponents. The east wind rises, and for us Americans the storm clouds gather. But few there are in the halls of Congress who seem to care
