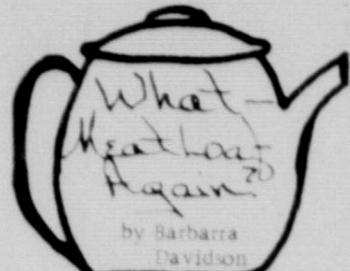

**CHERRY PIE PIQUEANT**  
3 Tbsp. freshly squeezed lemon juice  
3 Tbsp. milk  
3 Tbsp. butter  
1/4 c. sugar  
1 Tbsp. all-purpose flour  
2 Tbsp. grated lemon rind  
1/8 tsp. salt  
3 eggs  
1 partially baked 9-inch pastry shell

Combine lemon juice, milk, and butter in saucepan; heat to melt butter. Combine sugar, flour, lemon rind, salt, and eggs; beat slightly with a fork. Add lemon juice mixture and beat lightly by hand until well blended. Pour filling into a warm pastry shell. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 to 45 min. Filling should be puffed and light brown on top.

To freeze, cool pie, wrap securely and freeze. To serve, unwrap and thaw at room temperature.

(Reconstituted lemon juice and de-hydrated lemon peel may be used successfully in this pie.)

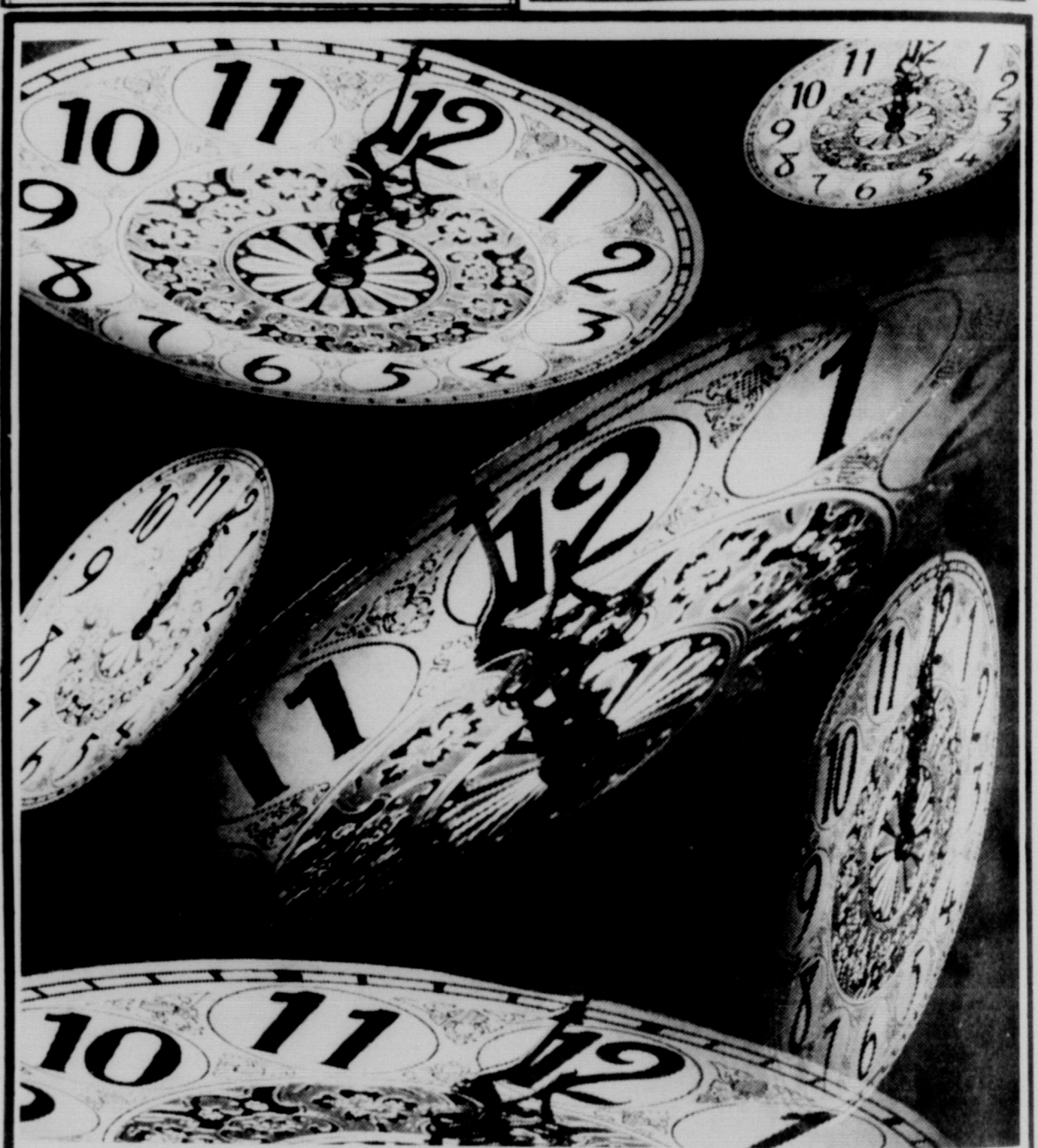

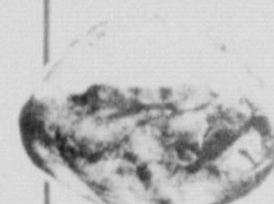

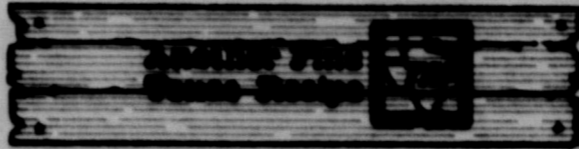

| 1 cup (8 ounces) diced mixed candied fruit | 3 c. sifted all-purpose flour       |
| 1 cup (5 ounces) chopped pitted dates      | 1 Tbsp. double-action baking powder |
| 1 cup (5 ounces) dark seedless raisins     | 2 tsp. cinnamon                     |
| 1/4 cup brandy                             | 2 tsp. baking soda                  |
| 2 cups granulated sugar                    | 1/2 tsp. salt                       |
| 1 1/2 cups vegetable oil                   | 3 cups finely grated carrots        |
| 4 eggs                                     | 1 1/2 cups coarsely chopped pecans  |

Soak fruits in brandy overnight; drain. Combine sugar and oil. Beat in eggs one at a time. Sift together flour, baking powder, cinnamon, soda and salt; reserve 2 tablespoons. Gradually add flour mixture to sugar mixture; mix until smooth. Coat fruits with reserved flour mixture. Stir in fruits, carrots and nuts. Pour into prepared 10x4-inch tube pan. Bake in 350-degree oven 1 hour 10 minutes to 1 hour 20 minutes. Cool 20 minutes. Remove from pan; cool on rack.

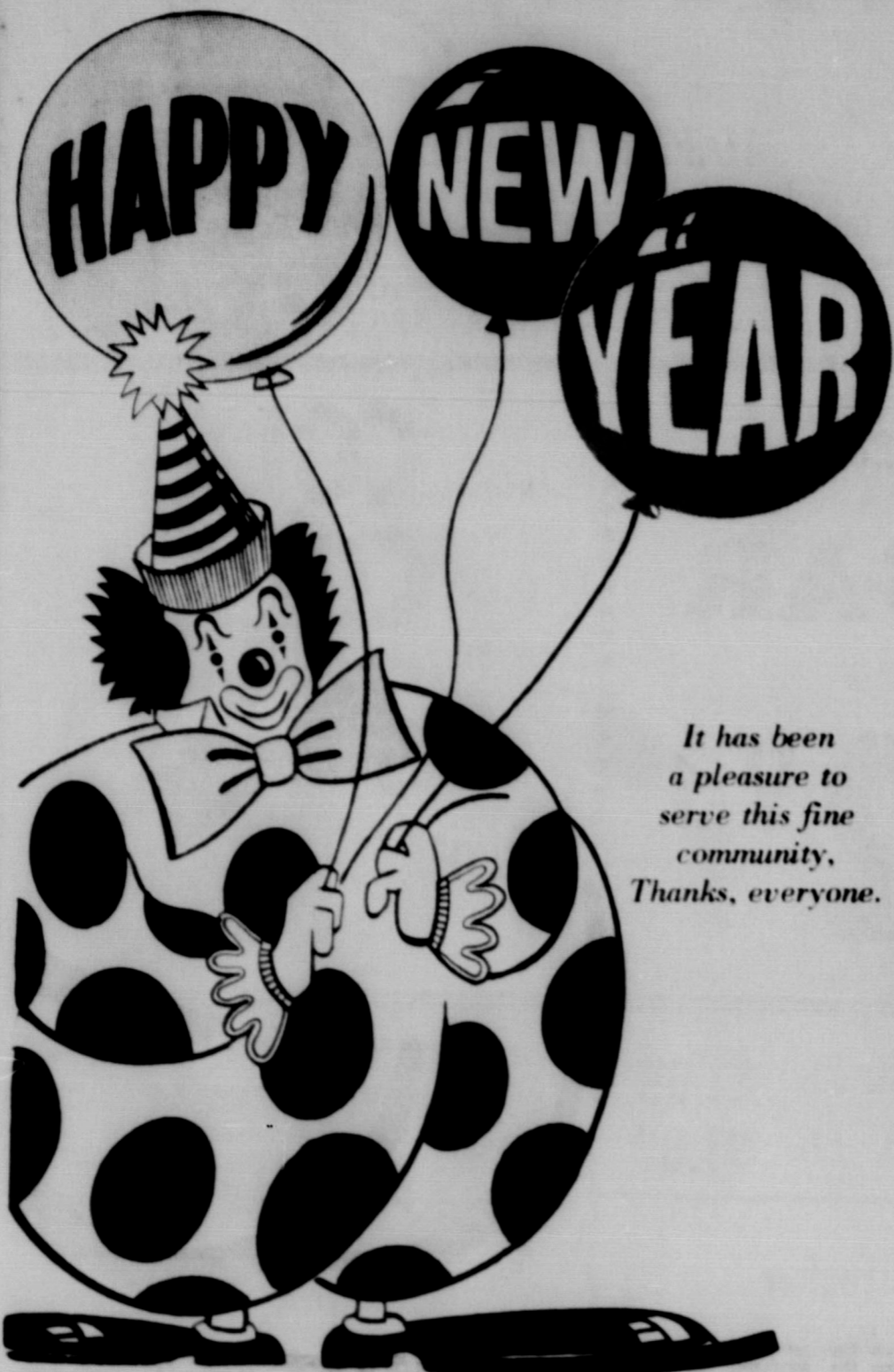

The Medicare hospital insurance deductible will be \$92 starting January 1, 1975, according to J.M. Talbot, social security manager. "A Medicare patient who goes into a hospital and starts a benefit period after December 31 will be responsible for the first \$92 of the hospital bill," Mr. Tal-

bot said. The 1974 deductible was \$84. Under the Medicare law, the amount will increase to keep it in line with the average cost of one day's stay in a hospital.

"The increase to \$92 for 1975 is a result of a review of hospital costs during 1973," Mr. Talbot said. "However, the present \$84 deductible remains in effect throughout any benefit period that started in 1974 even if the period of hospitalization goes into 1975."

Under the law, the increase in the deductible means there also will be increases starting January 1 in three other amounts Medicare patients pay for covered care.

For a hospital stay of over 60 days, the patient will pay \$23 a day (up from \$21) for covered services furnished on the 61st through the 90th day.

For a post-hospital stay of over 20 days in a skilled nursing facility, the patient will pay \$11.50 a day (up from \$10.50) for the 21st through the 100th day.

For reserve days used--after 90 days of hospital care in a benefit period--the patient will pay \$46 a day (up from \$42). Medicare hospital insurance helps pay for hospital stays and certain post-hospital care of people 65 and over, disabled people under 65 who have been entitled to social security disability benefits for 24 consecutive months or more, and many people who have chronic kidney disease and need dialysis or a transplant.
