AUSTIN, Tex .- Auto insurance rates are going up again -an average of 8.8 per cent statewide, or from \$8 to \$39 NEW YEAR for majority 1A and 1B adult drivers, depending on the rating territory they live in.

State Insurance Board announced the new rates effective January 16.

STATE

While the increase was judged necessary in view of rising auto repair and hospital rates and other costs, it was less than half the 18.3 per cent requested by the insurance industry. It was also far below the boost recommended originally-16.8 per cent-by the Board's own staff.

Overall cost to drivers is stimated at about \$50 milion a year. Gov. Dolph Bristoe said the industry's request would have boomed the ost another \$60 million.

"Double digit inflation" destroyed potential savings which might have been achieved due to lower speed limits, reduced accidents and curtailed driving, said State Insurance Board Chairman Joe Christie.

Legislative Budget Board recommended a record \$3.343 billion biennial state general revenue budget which reached deep into the fat cushion which inflation and the energy crunch provided. However, LBB moved to

set aside a remaining \$500 million into a "permanent working capital account" to provide stability in cash flow and cover unexpected temporary deficits.

That leaves less than \$100 million of the surplus for the legislature to play with in ad-justing the 1976-77 biennial appropriations bill, and price tag of school finance formula revision (not covered in the LBB recommendations) could run to \$1 billion. Lawmakers could, of course, throw out all the LBB proposals and start over.

Bells are rung, sirens sounded and whis-tles blown to celebrate its arrival and resolutions, sadly soon be broken, made. The New Year's celebration in

Scotland receives more attention than Christmas. The big ritual of New Year's Day is First Footing The first person, the First Footer, to enter the house un-invited on New Year's Day, of ten carrying symbolic gifts of bread, salt, coal and money and usually a piece of evergreen, bring good luck in the New Year. The requirements are strict: it must be a man, dark-haired, not flat footed or crosshaired, not had footed of cross-eyed and preferably not a stran-ger. In Lancaster, for a female to be the first to enter the house was to let bad luck in for the coming year. Most important is to begin the New Year as you would like it to no on hou would like it to go on: have plenty of money in the pocket, dine well, rise early, pay your debts and lend nothing. At Wick in the North of Scotland the old year is ceremonially burned out with great bonfires. the people gather round to dance and lighted torches are carried



60 days, the patient will pay \$23 a day (up from \$21) for covered services furnished on the 61st through the 90th day. For a post-hospital stay of over 20 days in a skilled nursing facility, the patient will pay \$11.50 a day (up from \$10, 50) for the 21st through

the 100th day. For reserve days used -- after 90 days of hospital care in a benefit period -- the patient will pay \$46 a day (up from \$42). Medicare hospital insurance helps pay for hospital stays and certain post-hospital care of people 65 and over, disabled people under 65 who have been entitled to social security disability benefits for 24 consecutive months or more, and many people who have chronic kidney disease and need dialysis or a transplant. 




