BE READY FOR WAR. COLLEGES AND MEN.

D. Avcock, chief of Harvard's Infantile Paralysis Commission, reports that the paralysis germ has been classified, and a suitable animal is sought to produce an antitoxin. Dr. Aycock agrees with Doctors Flexner and Nougchi, of the Rockefeller Institute, that the germ is so small that it would pass through any filter that can be made.

Some horse or other animal will supply the right serum for anti-toxin, and then anti-vivisection-ists will roar and another heavy load of fear will have been lifted from the hearts of mothers.
