The fly is a carrier of the germs of intestinal diseases, such as typhoid, dysentery and cholera, from the excretia to food supplies; and of germs such as tuberculosis and diphtheria. It is reported that a single female fly may deposit as many as two thousand eggs or more in several batches and sometimes an interval of only 36 hours may occur between deposition of large batches of eggs.

The body of the housefly is thickly covered with hairs and bristles, and this is especially true of its legs. Even more dangerous than the transerence of germs on legs and body are the greater numbers of germs in its body which are voided and regurgitated.

It is dangerous to swat the fly because its germs still live and its mashed and exposed body is an added danger. Its germs should by all means be killed with it. Many Health Boards strongly oppose fly swatting.




