### **WATCHMAN IS ASSURED SAY LION WORKERS**

More Than \$100 Subscribed By Business Men

#### COUNTY WILL HELP

#### Sheriff Willis Will Be Asked To Name Watchman Deputy

A nightwatchman to make the rounds of the business section of Ozona to guard against theft and fire is practically assured, according to the report of the committee headed by Chris Meinecke as chair man made to the Lions Club at its meeting Monday.

Mr. Meinecke reported that he had made a fairly complete canvass of the business men of the town and found them almost unanimously in favor of a watchman. .Mr. Meinecke also circulated a subscription list among the business firms and around \$100 a month was pledged toward paying the salary of a watchman. This amount was secured from only a part of the business firms of the town and Mr. Meinecke declared that he felt reasonably certain that a sufficient amount could be secured to assure the employment of a watchman.

Babcock Tells About Blowflies

O. G. Babcock, Sutton County representative of the bureau of entomology, United States Department of Agriculture, has trapped flies in the Carlsbad Cave in New Mexico and on top of the Rockies in Colorado, and he brings the information that airplanes are being used in Louisiana for experimental purposes to trap flies in the air

Mr. Babcock thinks the black plowfly is the worst in Southwes Texas and that its favorite breeding ground is in carcasses of animals and birds. He says there is no possibility of eradicating the fly in the ranch country but that it can be reduced in numbers.
