

Wilson Airplane Wins 3rd In Race

Ship Piloted By S.A.T. Pilot Takes Purse In Abilene Fete

Third place in a thirty-mile air race staged at Abilene Sunday as a part of the celebration held there on the occasion of the official opening of the Abilene airport, was won by the Travelair airplane own ed by Lee Wilson of Ozona, Mr. Wilson reported upon his return here Monday.

The Ozona man's ship was flown in the race by Howard Woodall, veteran pilot of the Southern Air Transport and pilot of the first passenger ship flown on the air route from Dallas to El Paso. A purse of \$25 was awarded Mr. Wilson.

The army flying corps staged a demonstration of air tactics as a part of the air circus which marked the opening of the Abilene airport. All classes of fighting craft were exhibited by the army flying units, including a big bomber, pursuit ships, observation planes, etc. A huge crowd was on hand to witness the celebration, Mr. Wil-

When lines are out of order in New York they are "not working" in London. For what Americans usually designate as "talking" over the telephone, with the British is "speaking."-Exchange.




