ALL OF WEST TEXAS MOURNS COUCH DEATH

Hundreds Here To Attend Funeral Services Sunday

MASONS IN CHARGE

Friends From All Over The State Pay Tribute To Builder

Hundreds of friends from all over Texas, and especially from this section of West Texas, followed the remains of Stephen Edmond Couch, millionaire Crockett County ranchman and pioneer West Texas builder who was instantly killed about 9 o'clock Friday morning when he was struck by the propellor of his airplane at Marfa to its last resting place in Cedar Hill Cemetery here Sunday afternoon. He was 73 years old at the time of his death.

The procession, one of the longest ever seen here, reached from the cemetery at the edge of town to nearly the downtown section. Hundreds of cars were here from other towns, attesting the popularity of the deceased in every section where he was known.
