> The question was discussed at the Lions Club luncheon Monday noon and members of the club were enthusiastic over the prospect to obtain a supply of natural gas for local consumption. With a view to further attracting the interest of officials of the Oklahoma gas concern, which is the distributing company for San Angelo, in bringing a line to Ozona from the Texon-San Angelo line, the Lions Club appointed a committee composed of Evart White. M. M. Fulmer and C. C. Luther to work with the Commissioners Court in placing before the gas company what information is available regarding the local sit-

A franchise was granted several months ago by the Commissioners Court of this county to an individual for a local gas distribution system. This franchise was not exclusive, however, and County Judge Chas. E. Davidson declared that the court would be more than willing to grant another franchise to any concern if there is a prospect of getting natural gas for Ozona. The person to whom this franchise was granted has apparently made no move toward piping gas to the city and the Commissioners have pledged themselves to co-operate with any concern that is seriously considering a local gas distribution system, Judge Davidson declared.
