## ROCK-THROWING SHERIFF, ATTACKED Street Grading BY WILD BOAR, FELLS ANIMAL WITH BOULDER AFTER CHASE THRU BRUSH

Sheriff W. S. Willis of Crockett County, famed throughout this area as the "gunless sheriff" and who attained no little fame a few years ago when he stopped a fleeing prisoner, who had bolt ed for his freedom, with a well aimed rock, added to his laurels as a marksman with a rock yesterday afternoon when he stopped a charging wild boar which he had wounded with a rifle shot a few moments before.

Sheriff Willis, with two companions, Warren Clayton and Jake Young, was on a deer hunt and the sheriff sat down on a rock on the rim of a canyon while his two companions circled the header. Watching for deer in the canvon, Sheriff Willis spied three wild hogs. Picking out the largest, he sent a rifle bullet into him and then went down after the kill.

When he arrived, however, he found the boar crouched on his haunches, one of his hind legs broken by the rifle bullet, and in somewhat of a temper at such treatment. As the sheriff neared the wounded animal, the big fellow charged out on three legs. his three-inch tusks bared and ready for action.

Then it was that some im-

promptu clearing was done in that canyon, according to reports. Mr. Willis had thought he was tired when he sat on the rim rock to rest, but when that hog came charging out of the brush, he promptly forgot his fatigue and the small trees and underbrush began to come down as sheriff and wild hog crash ed through, the hog grinding his teeth and "goosh-gooshing" at the sheriff's flying

"I didn't have time to turn and shoot," Mr. Willis explained.

Beating the hog by inches, Shertff Willis finally ascended a big rock outeropping where he was safe from the wounded beast and then it was that he discarded his rifle for a trusty rock. The first throw caught the big boar squarely between the eyes and his fighting days were over.

When Clayton and Young returned, there stood the proud sheriff-hunter, one foot propped on the fallen carcass of his prey-the conqueror of the wild. And it was some time before he finally admitted to his companions that the kill was more in self defense than from the sporting urge.



## Texas Wool Industry

Editor's Note-This the eleventh of a series of articles dealing with the possibilities of the wool managing director of the Southwest Industrial Development Bureau, is an acknowledged authority on the subject of industrialization for Texas.

The next question that arises

Under the present conditions of the wool market and the cloth market, would it be advisable to start this movement at this time?

So many people, in thinking of a factory, visualize vast acreage. thousands of employes, and when they get this picture they seem impressed with the impossibility of getting such a plant. If they could only see that those plants they have in mind must have, at one time, started in a small way and gradually built up to the pres ent proportions, it should appeal to them that a start is necessary to bring them about.

The present condition of the cloth market is in a bad way. From 1923 until 1929 there were 168 wool manufacturing plants which passed out of existence, A change of conditions was partly responsible for this. In the old days a man wore a blue serge light suit in summer and heavy weight in winter, with the result that these big mills were turning out a volume of one kind of cloth that enabled them through quantity production to succeed. Then suddenly men's styles began to change. Stripes and checks and colors all became the fashion, and these enormous mills with their enormous production were up a gainst a very severe problem in the making of short runs of cloth of the different designs desired. It really meant that the small mill was more easily adapted to the different kinds of cloth and had a distinct advantage, and a great many of them have profited thru this change of conditions. There has naturally been a cur

tailment of production, and merchants' stocks today are at the lowest of any time for many years. industry in Texas. 


