maximums have been set: Counties under 10,000 population, \$3,-000; between 10,000 and 25,000, \$3,250; between 25,000 and 37,500 \$3,500; between 37,500 and 75,000, \$4,250; between 75,000 and 150,-000, \$4,750; above 150,000, \$5,000. The rates do not apply to all fee officers alike. The maximums are for more important county officers. Lower figures are fixed for justices of the peace, constables, etc.
