Bomber Crews Return To Base; More In 2 Weeks

Another Class To Use Local Port In War Games Training

Fledgling bombardiers from the San Angelo Army Air Force bombardier school, after a week of embat maneuvers, attacking "enas possible like those which they will find in combat areas, packed up their equipment and returned to the San Angelo field Monday to await their graduation exercises

The bombardiers, pilots and ground crews had been stationed for a week at t he Ozona airport west of town, which was being used to simulate an advanced bomber base in the war games. Sleeping in pup tents, eating from Army field kitchens, keeping on the alert for raiders and servicing Baptist Vacation their own planes, fusing and loading their own bombs and attacking "enemy installations" on West Texas target ranges in the area, the men got a taste of what actual war will be like and received the for their job of blasting Axis war production centers, shipping and military installations.

Another group from the San Angelo field will undergo similar training maneuvers in about two weeks, officers here with the outfit said. The Ozona airport, taken over by the Army Air Force as an auxiliary field, will be in almost continuous use by the pilots and bombardiers in training at air fields in the area, particularly the bombardier school and

Each succeeding class of bomeuvers similar to the session just ended. The class here last week was divided into four squadrons. two occupying the local field under attack from the other two and then the groups alternating.

As a fitting finale to the week's maneuvers, a sneak noon-hour attack was staged by a group of planes from the San Angelo field on the final day of maneuvers Sunhowever, by alert look-outs at the field and before they had completed their rendezvous and came skimming the tree tops to the attack, the field force had blanketed parked planes and the camp area with a thick smoke-screen.

However, the intrepid pilots put their bombardiers over the target in spite of the smoke screen and many a puff of chalk bomb bursts mushroomed up from the chow line

Price Reduction On Meat Effective Under U. S. Subsidy Plan

Reductions in meat prices, rangng from two cents per pound on certain types of hamburger to eleven cents per pound on porterhouse steaks, became effective on Monday under the OPA roll-back of meat prices.

The reductions are effective on all meat except cured and processed pork, for which the effective date will be July 5.

The reductions vary from three cents per pound on cheaper cuts to as high as eleven cents on Grade AA choice cuts. Typical re-

ductions are as follows: Good T-bone, 10e per pound Round steak, 5e per pound Chuck roast, 3¢ to 5¢ per pound Ground beef, 2e to 8e per pound,
