Ranchers Develop Operative Technique For Cancer-Eye Cure

The rancher who learned the business through experience will often give the textbook rancher due credit, but sometimes, often in fact, the school of experience develops workable theories even before the theory is hatched in the classroom.

A local case is in point. Recently the A & M College promulgated a recommendation for an operation on cancer-eyed cattle for removal of the eye and all diseased tissue to effect a cure.

Years ago the famous partnership of brothers, W. R. and J. M. Baggett, developed this technique for treatment of this malady in cattle with marked success.

In years past, cancer-eye was often fatal. Development of pinkeye often ran into cancer, and cancer was usually fatal. One day the Baggett brothers decided to do a bit of experimenting on a cow that they considered doomed anyway. They caught up the animal, removed the eyeball, cut away eye lids and all affected tissues. To their delight, the wound healed quickly, the animal recovered com pletely, and except for the loss of an eye, was as sound as any on the ranch. Since that time, they have followed this practice with almost 100 percent success.


