Despite the fact that shortening is no longer rationed, housewives will continue to receive two meat points per pound for waste kitchen fats, J. R. Bailey, chairman of the local War Price and Rationing Board, announced today.

Kitchen fats have a great variety of uses, and replace edible fats, Mr. Bailey explained. These waste fats contribute to the overall fats supply, vitally necessary in our war effort.

Those who patriotically turn in kitchen fats will help continue the zero point value on shortening, salad and cooking oil, Mr. Bailey added.

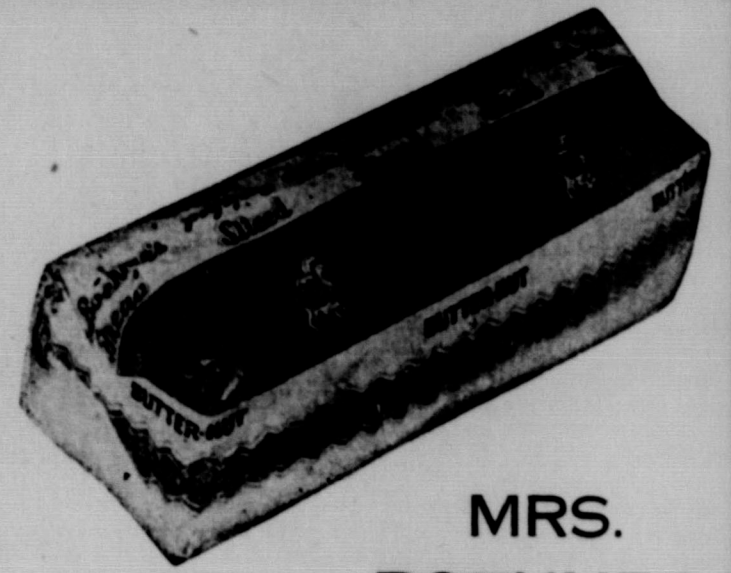

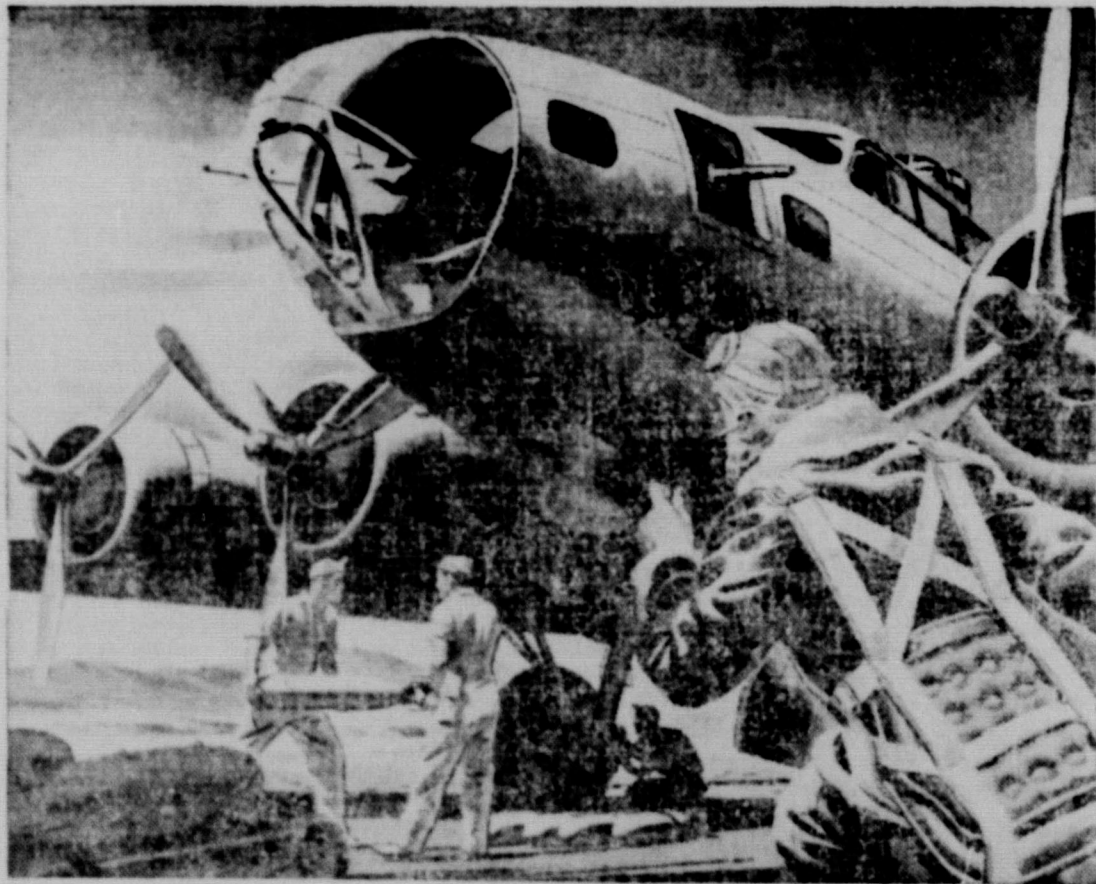

Six Accepted for Armed Services in Fort Bliss Exams

Six men out of the group sent last week to the induction station in El Paso for pre-induction physical examinations were found acceptable for the armed services, it was announced this week following official reports on the examinations.

Four of the six accepted are in 2C classifications, men engaged in agriculture, who were ordered for physical examinations under a special directive from state headquarters, covering men in this classification under 26 years of age. In this group were Joe Tom Davidson, James Childress, Dudley Ingham and Henry Cox. These men are not subject to immediate induction under present rules, which, of course, may be changed.

Others accepted in the group sent from here were Bernie B. Adwell and John Dalton Ward, the latter a transfer from another county.

Mrs. Lee Wilson, who has two sons in England, has had letters from both of them and both report all is well. Lt. J. K. Colquitt, pilot, U. S. Army Air Forces, has written that he is in North Ireland in tactical training in navigation. Sgt. Will (Shorty) Colquitt wrote his mother on June 13 that he is stationed at a transportation center in England. Both report their health is good.

J. H. Williams, Ozona grocer, was taken to a San Angelo hospital Sunday after suffering a heart attack. He was reported resting well yesterday.

Sun Shannon Test Scheduled to Shoot

Sun No. 2 Margaret A. Shannon estate, south offset to Sohio's No. 1 Shannon, northwest extension to the Shannon field in western Crockett County, was due to shoot with 300 quarts of nitroglycerin after plugging back approximately 200 feet from 2,402-04 feet. It encountered three-quarters of a barrel of sulphur water from 2,404-04 feet, establishing the water table. Location is in the C NW NE 23-1-GC&SF.

John I. Moore No. 2 Shannon, C SW SW 24-1-GC&SF, was due to run 10-inch casing to slightly below 600 feet. It is a west offset to Moore No. 1 Shannon, recently completed on the pump at 2,185 feet for 256 barrels daily.

Sohio No. 2 Shannon, C SW SE 24-1-GC&SF, north offset to Sohio No. 1 Shannon, drilled plugs from casing at around 790 feet, after being shutdown for an engine. Sohio No. 3 Shannon, C SE SE 24-1-GC&SF, was running 7-inch casing, bottomed slightly below 2,100 feet.

W. E. Lucas, BM second class, U. S. Navy, arrived this week for a visit with his family on his way to a new station in New Orleans. Lucas, who suffered a broken leg in overseas service last year and spent a 30-day leave in Ozona after being released from the hospital, has been stationed on the West Coast. He still walks with a slight limp but says that his injured leg is nearly as good as new again.
