Drouth Breaking Rains Fall Over Ranch Country

Week-Long Falls Soak Wide Area; Up to 6 Inches Recorded

Threat of drouth, the most awesome ogre facing the West Texas ranch industry, was removed for the time being at least, by general rains which continued throughout last week over a wide section of ranch country.

The bountiful falls relieved drouthy conditions which had persisted for months and was at the point of spelling tragedy for ranch operators.

Were a ranchman able to place his order and receive delivery on an ideal rain, none would have specified a more ideal fall than that which lavished moisture on the parched earth in this area during last week. Unlike the "drouthbreaking rains common to this area, a sluicing fall which often does almost as much damage as Crockett county's permanent good, the past week's drouth breakfirst day or two of the continuing falls, but water holes and tanks were filled as the slow falling

Ozona recorded a total of approximately 4% inches, including a heavy downpour Thursday afternoon which sent the small draw skirting the eastern edge of the town out of its banks for the first time in several years.

The western half of the state, parched by months of drouth, was especially favored in the drouth breaking rains, the Balmorhea area reportedly receiving 13 inches of rainfall which sent draws out of banks and washed out fences. The Pecos river on the western border of Crockett county was on a rise of several feet as a result of




