Voters Decide Sewer, Water **Issues Saturday**

\$50,000 Bond Issue For Expanding Systems Proposed

Voters of the Crockett County District No. 1, which includes the area embraced within the limits of the town of Ozona, will be called upon next Saturday, April 27, to decide the fate of a proposed \$50,000 combined water and sewer system bond issue up for a vote of the people on that date.

The election has been called by the directors of the district for the purpose of submitting to the voters the proposed issues, divided in to two propositions, one for the issuance of water works improvement bonds and the other for the issuance of bonds for the improvement and expansion of the sanitary sewer system serving the town.

The two proposed bond issues, ter works system, and \$23,500 for expansion and improvement of the sewer system, are proposed as a means of financing necessary enlargements of the local systems to take care of a growing city.

Two separate ballots will be provided for a vote on each of the two issues affecting the water works and the sewer system. The sewer system is now owned and operated by the county but if voters approve this issue the system will be transferred to the water district for operation and maintenance and the expansion and improvements made under direction of the district board.
