Voters Approve \$50,000 Water, Sewer Bonds

Only Token Vote Registred; One Vote Opposes Issues

Only an estimated ten per cent of the qualified voters of the district, whose boundaries enclose the town of Ozona, cast their ballots on the question of issuing \$50,000 in water and sewer bonds of the Crockett County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 in an election held here Satur-

But there was an overwhelming sentiment in favor of the bonds among the few who did take the trouble to register their vote on the question, and since "silence to 6,221 feet and ran 2% casing to that the other 600 or more voters who did not go to the polls were also in favor of the proposition.

Only 67 voters marked ballots during the day's voting, and of opposition to the two propositions as submitted-and it was thought possible that that one vote of opposition was an error on the part of the voter in marking the ballot.

By their approval of the proposed sewer bond issue, voters by inference approved the transfer of the sewer system properties from the county to the water control district. This transfer is to be made without cost to the district, the county relinquishing control and operation of the county-built system to the water district. It is expected that a schedule of monthly connection charges to sewer users will be drawn up and announced soon by the district board of directors.


