AUSTIN, Texas. — Texas small towns are becoming more dangerous each year for motorists with an alarming increase in fatal traffic accidents shown last year, the Texas Safety Association revealed this week.

The death toll for towns under 2,500 population in the State during 1946 was 76 per cent above the 1945 mark, George M. Clarke, managing director of the Association, announced.

Certificate of Title

Now Required On All

HOUSE TRAILERS

Owners of House Trailers are advised that it is now necessary to secure a Certificate of Title on these vehicles the same as for motor vehicles. Under H. B. No. 286 recently passed by the Legislature the term "House Trailer" means a vehicle without automotive power designed for human habitation and for carrying persons and property upon its own structure and for being drawn by a motor vehicle.

The same type of Title will be issued on House Trailers as is now issued on motor vehicles except that the words "House Trailer" will appear under the Title number.

The 1 percent tax, collected on motor vehicles, will not be collected on House Trailers.

House Trailers **MUST BE REGISTERED** at the time application for Title is filed, and House Trailers now registered should apply for Title.

To register and secure Certificate of Title to a House Trailer owner must present manufacturer's certificate or bill of sale, serial number of the trailer, its weight and make. On homemade House Trailers the owner should execute an Affidavit of Ownership for Homemade House Trailers.

If House Trailer does not have serial number an application for assignment of a serial number must be made for which a charge of \$1 will be made.

3-Year-Plan For Raising Teacher Standards Adopted
 Public school systems which expect to remain on the accredited list of the Southern Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges will have to begin the gradual elimination of teachers of sub-standard qualifications employed during the war emergency period, according to action taken last week by the state committee in Austin.
 A system of gradual elimination of the non-degree teachers over a three-year period was adopted by the committee.
 No specific schedule of hours of progress to be made by the non-degree teachers taken into accredited school systems during the emergency is set up. But no teachers having less than two full years of standard college credit will be eligible for employment in accredited systems during the 1947-48 session. Likewise, during the 1948-49 session, none of the former emergency teachers having less than three full years of college credit will be eligible to teach and in the session 1949-50 none without college degrees will be eligible to teach.
 All new teachers being employed for the first time in accredited school systems during the 1947-48 session and thereafter will be required to hold a minimum of the bachelor's degree from standard four-year colleges or universities. Because of the difficulty of securing academically qualified teachers in highly specialized phases of the school program, such as trades education and band, school officials will be authorized, with the approval of the State Superintendent, to hire not to exceed one such teacher of less than standard academic qualifications in small schools and not more than 5 per cent of the teaching staff in larger schools.

WEEKLY SWING OF SOUTHWEST FARM MARKETS

(USDA) — Southwest farm markets remained generally firm to strong last week, but easiness cropped up on some types of classes of nearly all commodities, according to the Production and Marketing Administration, U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Movement of new crop wheat, oats, and barley had gotten well under way and trade sources expected sorghums to join the parade in two or three weeks. Wheat prices sagged steadily, and lost about 20 cents per bushel, closing at \$2.25 Friday. Corn and sorghums advanced several cents, while oats and barley changed very little.

Feed markets showed a stronger tone last week, with higher prices for oilseed meals and corn feeds. Southwest alfalfa growers had about finished harvesting the first cutting. Most peanut areas enjoyed favorable conditions for the growing crop and for late planting. Texas wool sold from 47½ to 52c per pound, grease basis.

Cattle sold generally strong to \$1.00 or more higher last week, but easiness developed on lower

grade cows at San Antonio, and on lower grades of all classes at Fort Worth. Common to medium steers and yearlings brought \$14 to \$20 at Houston, while medium to good kinds realized \$19 to \$23.50 at Fort Worth. San Antonio bought medium steers at \$21 to \$23.25. Oklahoma City moved good and choice steers at \$24.50 to \$25.50.

Hogs scored net advances of 25 cents to \$1.00 or more at most southwest terminals last week, but butcher hogs lost mostly 25 cents at Oklahoma City, and sows dropped \$1 at San Antonio. Bulk of good and choice butchers brought \$24.75 to \$25 at Fort Worth, and \$24.75 to \$25.50 at Denver. Late top was \$24.75 at San Antonio and Oklahoma City.

Some sheep and lamb markets made small to sharp gains, but lambs dropped \$1 to \$3 at Fort Worth, old crop lambs fell at San Antonio, and ewes weakened at some places. Good spring lambs moved at \$20 at San Antonio; while good and choice kinds turned at \$19 to \$23 at Fort Worth; \$24.75 to \$25.25 at Wichita; and \$24.50 to \$26 at Denver.

Whooping Cough On Increase In Texas

AUSTIN. — A statement released today by Dr. Geo. W. Cox, State Health Officer, indicates that the incident of whooping cough in Texas is at present almost three times as high as the seven year median.

"Prevention and control of whooping cough, especially among infants and small children, may be accomplished through use of approved vaccine and convalescent serum," Dr. Cox asserted, "and it is important that such measures be taken to protect them. Neglecting to do so, and allowing

the young child to suffer an attack of this disease, may seriously impair his future health."

"The infectious agent of germ of whooping cough, is transmitted by droplets expelled in coughing, sneezing, or speaking," Dr. Cox said. "The discharges from the nose and throat are dangerous to susceptible persons; the need for early recognition and careful isolation of whooping cough is obvious."

The first sign of this disease is usually a dry cough, which persists day and night and tends to become increasingly severe. The disease is fully developed when vomiting of food and whooping accompany the paroxysm of cough.

Dr. Cox stressed the fact that children who have whooping cough should not attend school and should be isolated so that they will

not come in contact with other children until three weeks after the appearance of typical signs of the disease.

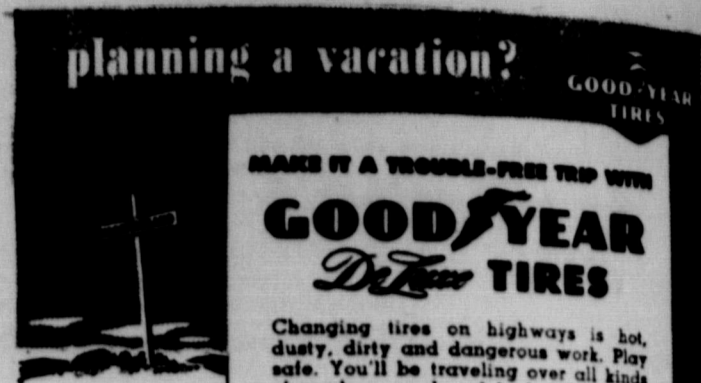

353 Americans Buried Unknowns Identified

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Positive identification of 353 American soldiers who died in the Philippine Islands during the period of Japanese occupation and who were buried as unknowns has been announced by the War Department. All of the unknowns who have been identified were among a group of approximately 1600 who

were buried in the Camp O'Donnell Prisoner of War Cemetery on Luzon, Philippine Islands. Their remains were disinterred and re-

buried in the United States Armed Forces Cemetery No. 2 following the end of fighting in the Philippine Islands.

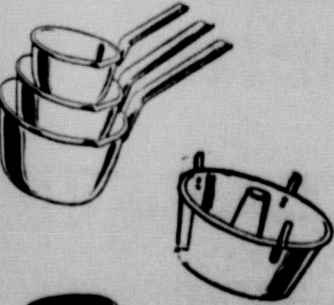

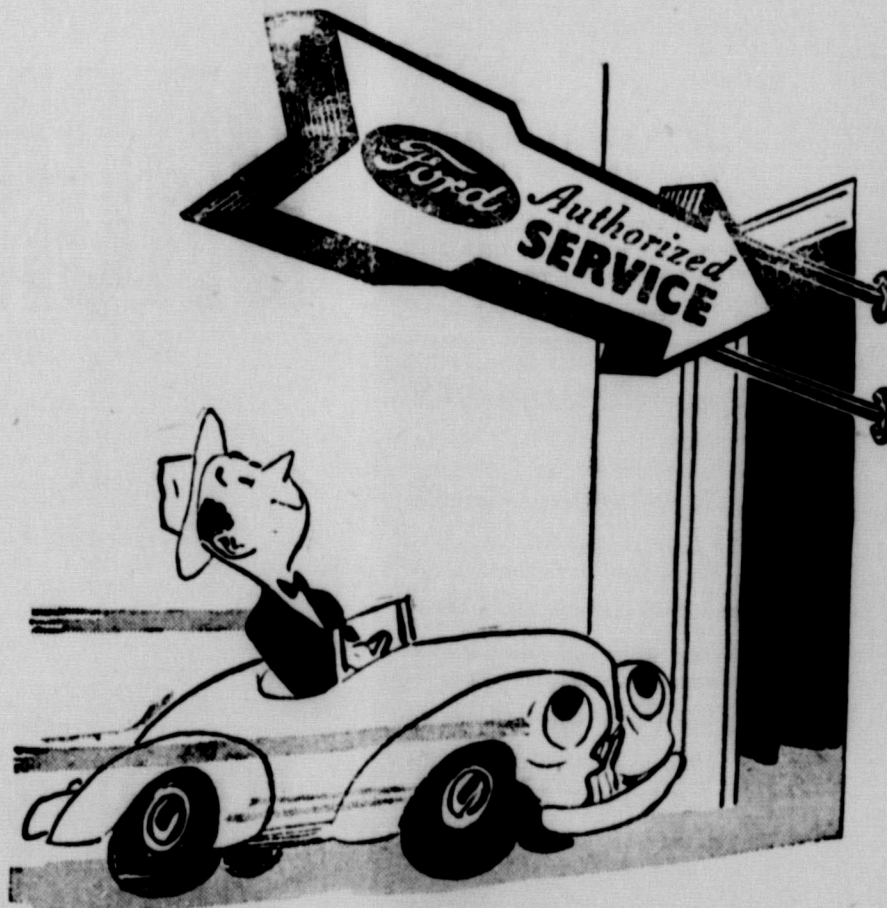

Air Rescue Service Provided This Area

An emergency air search and rescue service for fliers lost or forced down within this area is now being conducted by the Army Air Rescue Service operating from Biggs Field, El Paso, Texas. Assistance will be given whether planes in trouble are civilian or military, and the unit is also authorized to transport by air, anyone injured in ground accidents when other transportation is not available.

All persons who have knowledge of an airplane crash or emergency landing in this vicinity are urged to place a collect long-distance telephone call to the Army Air Rescue Service, El Paso, Texas, telephone East 3181, Extension 3991.

The area covered by the Biggs Field unit includes more than 468,000 square miles and takes in Texas, Southeastern New Mexico, and the Southern portion of Oklahoma. A force of thirty-two officers and enlisted men is constantly standing by on a 24-hour alert basis to respond to calls for assistance.

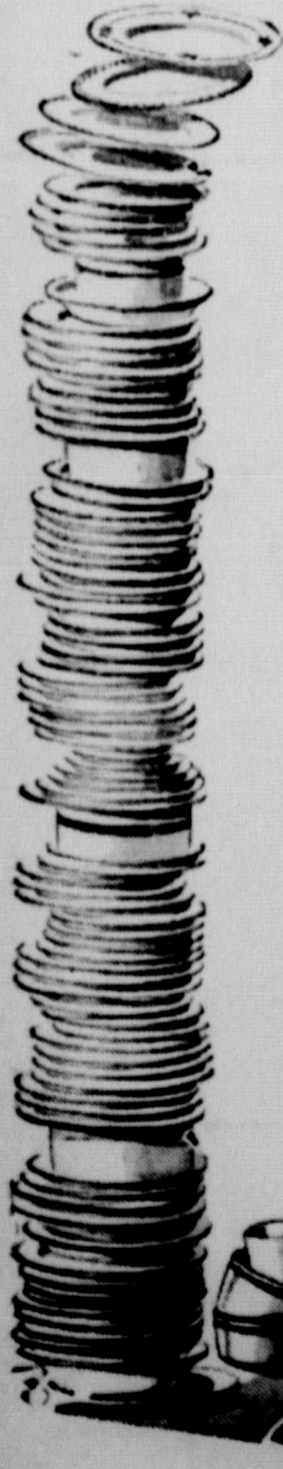
