Water Said Used To Control Texas Pierce Gas Blow

Effort Continues to Kill Blowout of Dry Gas

Unofficial reports were heard here yesterday that efforts to bring under control the blowout of dry gas in the Texas Co. No. 1 Victor I. Pierce, deep wildcat 21 miles south of Ozona, through use of water was meeting with success. Halliburton mudding crews were at work continuing the effort to kill the well.

The test blew out when cement was drilled out to the bottom and two feet of new hole made to a total reported depth of 11,839 feet. The hole recently was plugged back after gas under high pressure was encountered in drilling to 11,837 feet where circulation was lost and could not be re-established. Five and a half inch casing was cemented at 11,716 feet. It was when the cement was drilled from the casing and from the hole below it that the blowout occurred.

The gas flow was unofficially estimated at 50 million cubic feet and was under such high pressure that complete shut-off could not be effected with the valves. The Ellenburger was reported topped at 11,470 feet, 9,222 feet below sea level. Location is 998 feet from the east line of section 5-9-Clarissa W. Brown.

Texas Co. No. 1 Tom Smith, 660 feet from the south, 666 feet from the east line of the west half of the same section was drilling at 9,065 feet in sand and shale.

Hunt No. 1 Shannon estate at the south end of the Midway lane (Ellenburger) field had reached 6,578 feet in shale. Hunt filed application for a permit to drill No. 2 Margaret A. Shannon estate in the same area, 1,980 from the north 660 feet from the west line of M. J. Oglesby survey, abstract 5,101.

The test will be made a quarter mile south of Hunt No. 1 Shannon, now drilling. No. 1 Shannon is 2,607.3 feet west of Shell No. 1 Chambers county school land, which marked a south extension to the field.

Drouth Breaking Rains Fall Over Parts of County

Scattered Showers Bring Heavy Falls; Light in Some Areas

Scattered thundershowers the past three days have brought at least temporary relief from one of the worst drouth conditions that has plagued this area of West Texas since the drouth of the early thirties to a considerable area of Crockett county and other West Texas counties.

The showers have persisted to raise the hopes of the ranching folk for a break at last in the drouth which has gripped the country for months. Varying from quarter inch falls to two and three inches, the falls have covered a considerable territory in the past three or four days, with the heaviest and most widespread showers falling in late afternoon and early evening Tuesday. The showers first began Sunday night, concentrating to the south and southwest of Ozona and to the northwest. Monday afternoon and night more showers fell and again Tuesday night. The Tuesday night fall brought the most moisture to Ozona, 1.4 inches, with lighter showers earlier. Rains up to an inch and a half fell both Monday and Tuesday afternoons at the west edge of town, drenching a section of ranch country from Ozona to beyond the Texas - New Mexico Pump Station.

Heavy clouds continued to hang in the skies here yesterday giving promise of more showers or possibly a general rain, which would be the clincher for a final break in the long drouth.

Ozona Boys Enter Champ Schoolboy Roping Contests

Kerrville FFA and 4H Sponsor Events on June 10-11-12

Five Ozona boys have entered calf roping events in the World's Championship Boys' Calf Roping contest at Kerrville June 10, 11 and 12, sponsored by the Kerrville FFA chapter and the Kerr County 4-H Clubs, Bill Bergfeld, Crockett agent and 4-H Club sponsor, announced this week.

Entries have already been sent in for Lin Hicks, Sam Perner, Charlie Boy Davidson, Jack Coates and Bill Melton, Chris Perner and Buddy Phillips also plan to attend the roping but will not enter the contests. The boys will be accompanied by Mr. Bergfeld and some of the parents.

The three-day rodeo at Kerrville will feature high school boys and a couple of matched roping events, one a \$1,000 12-calf matched roping between Toots Mansfield of Big Spring and Tom Taylor of Blackwell. A 6-calf matched roping between Jack Hoggett of Kerrville and Jim Bob Altizer of Del Rio, two of the outstanding school boy calf ropers of Texas, will be another feature. The winner of this contest will be awarded a saddle. An exhibition performance by Tooter Savage, 8-year-old San Antonio cowboy with his bull whips and bucking horse, will be another added attraction. A high school girls clover leaf race will be staged with entries open to "any girl in the world who regularly attended high school during the 1947-48 year." A similar wide-open condition governs entry of the boys in the calf tie down and calf breakaway contests.

Go-round prizes for each of three go rounds in the calf breakaway, calf tie down and clover leaf race are being offered, first prize, a hat; second, breast strap; third, Levis; and fourth, a rope. Final prizes in these events will be first, a saddle; second, a pair of boots; third, pair of spurs, and fourth, saddle blanket. There will be no entry fees. A \$450 Gray one-horse trailer is also to be given away

Contract Awarded For Construction Methodist Church

G & E Const. Co. Is Low Bidder on \$208,- 000 Structure

The G & E Construction Co., owned by Gerri Von Froelich of San Angelo, was the successful bidder for the job of constructing the new Ozona Methodist Church when bids were opened by the building committee of the church at the courthouse last Saturday afternoon.

The G & E, one of four contracting firms to bid on the job, submitted a total bid of \$208,000 for construction of the entire building as designed by Architect Henry Steinbomer of San Antonio. However, contract was signed by the church with a few minor alterations in plans, for construction of the building without the east wing and little chapel for \$180,000, with an option to contract for construction of this wing and chapel for an additional \$25,000 within sixty days from date of the award.

Work was to begin on the building within ten days, but lines were being run and stakes set preparatory to beginning the work almost immediately.

GROUND BREAKING

Groundbreaking services will be held by the Methodist congregation at the building site at 7 o'clock next Sunday evening, the pastor, Rev. Horace M. King, announced this morning. The entire community is invited to participate in the services.

The new church building, to be of light tan brick, is to include the sanctuary facing south, 30 by 100 feet with a porte-cochere extending to the west and an entrance and office segment of the little chapel wing extending to the east, the social and dining hall and classroom wing connecting the sanctuary and the educational wing at the back, extending in "L" shape to the east.

The connecting wing, social and dining hall, youth division, including stage and kitchen, is to be 30 x 90 feet and the educational, 56 x 106 feet. The sanctuary or church auditorium is designed to seat 250 on the ground floor, not including the choir loft and balcony with provision for more than 100 more for capacity attendance. The court within the area of the "L", later to be paved, will provide space for 500 outdoor church or community gatherings, this space to be enclosed on the south if the little chapel wing is completed.

Mr. Von Froelich, who has a crew at work here now nearing completion of the new home for Mr. and Mrs. Joe T. Davidson, estimated that the new church would be completed within 12 months. No time limit was placed in the contract, which is to be a turn-key job.

When construction is completed, the Methodist congregation will again have a church home after six years without. The Methodist church, site of the present hospital and county building, was destroyed by fire in March, 1942, three months after the start of World War II, and labor and material shortages in wartime prevented replacement of the church immediately. Building funds, donated by members and friends of the church over the years, now total almost enough for construction of the present contracts and additional gifts are expected to finance the construction.

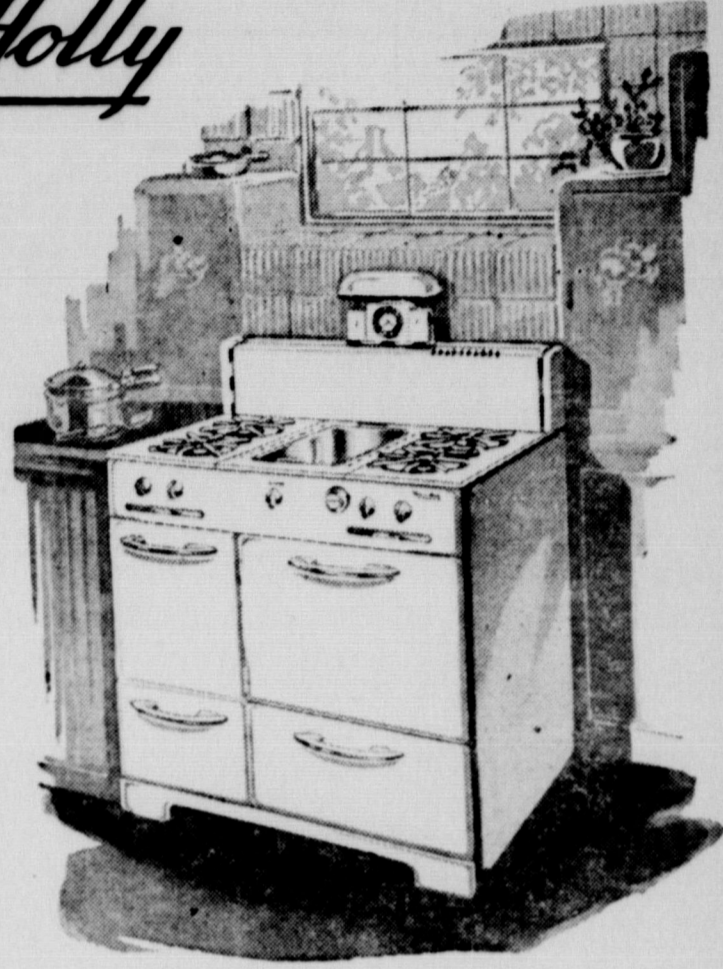

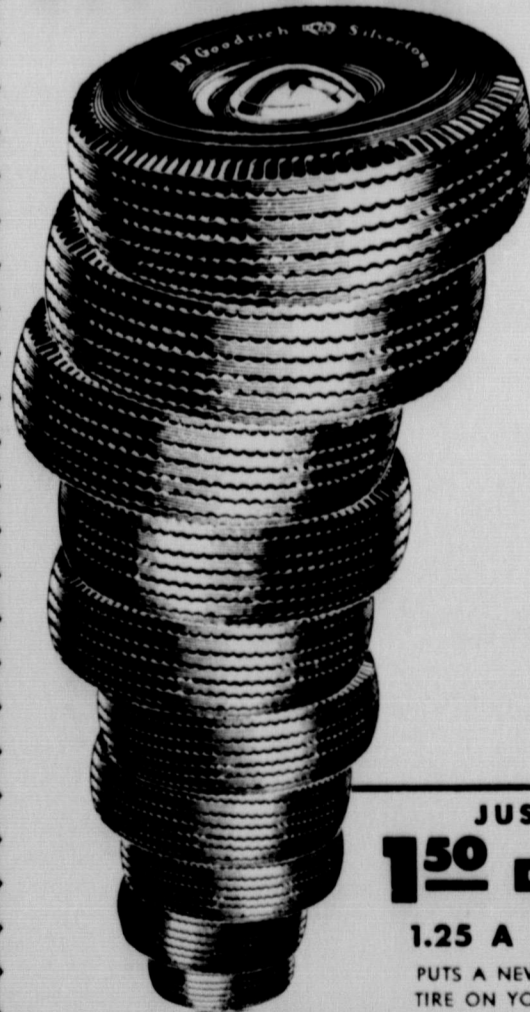

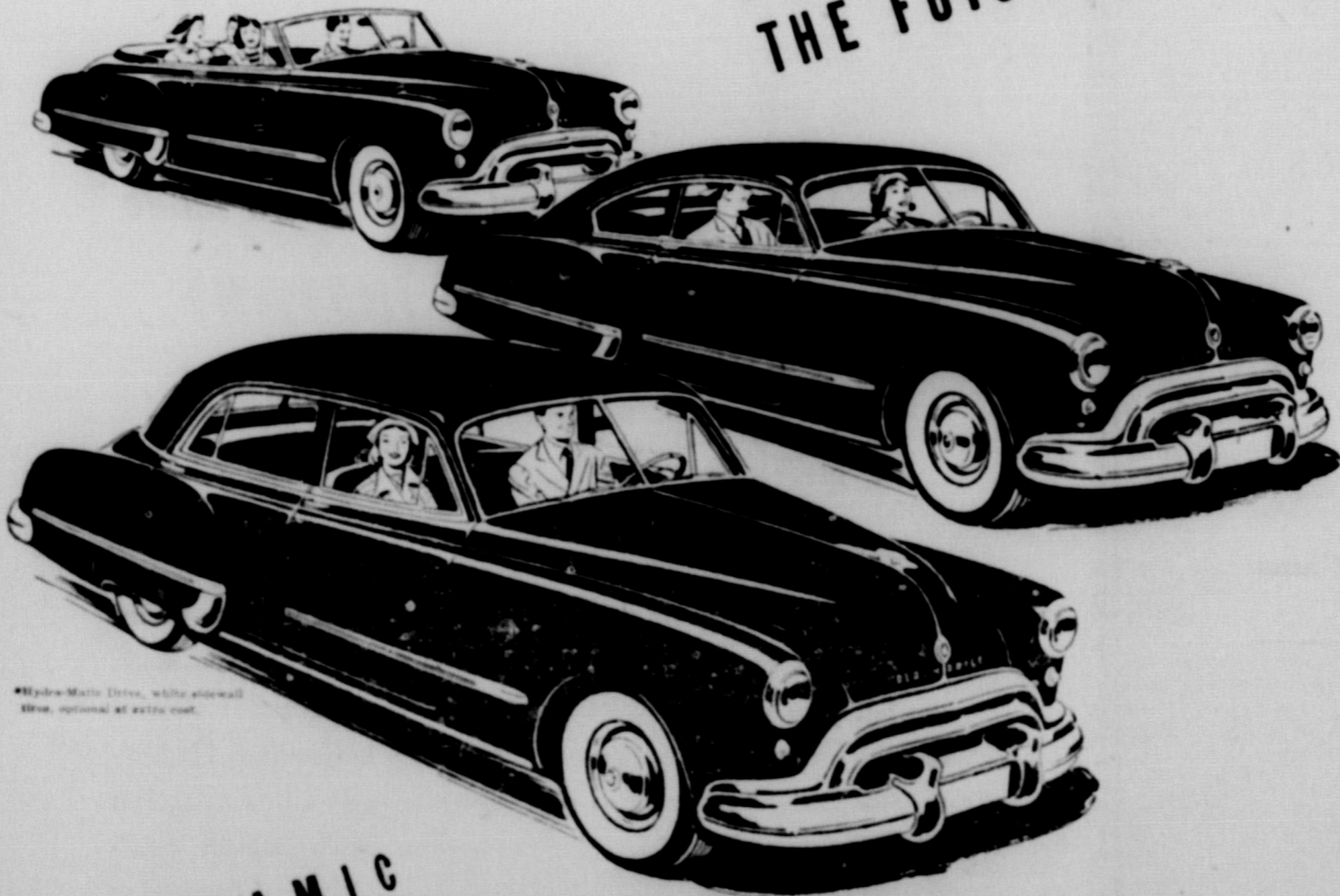
