Water District Board Studies Expansion Plan

\$100,000 Bond Issue May Be Proposed to Meet Need

With a view to meeting the the amount of revenue bonds which may be issued and to arrive at an estimate of the expansion need to provide water and sanitary sewer service to every part of the city, to increase the storage capacity and to make other improvements to the water plant.

This preliminary study will be made by engineers and bond experts, who will arrive at cost estimates and determine capacity of the district revenues for retiring additional revenue bonds. As soon as this information is assembled, the directors plan to place the matter before the people of the district for their determination by ballot.

Ashley G. Classen, consulting engineer from El Paso, Texas, is here this week to begin the engineering survey of the water and sewer plant and distribution system, study and estimate expansion needs to extend and improve water and sewer service throughout the town. After the engineering work is completed, bond experts will be called in to study the district's present and prospective revenues and thus to determine the amount and kind of bonds which may be issued.

Revenue bonds up to a total of \$100,000 may be proposed by the directors to meet a long-range expansion program for the system. This program will be in part that originally envisioned by the district when it was first created and original purchase and improvement bonds were issued to take over the water works system.
