**A MESSAGE TO THE PEOPLE OF OZONA**

dren who get revenge by destroying the theatre. We have had 45 seats cut and damaged in the show and the neon sign in front has been broken five times in the past six weeks. The ladies rest room was completely demolished and the wash basin torn off the wall. The water flooded the walls and we had to refinish the entire room.

Now, I am sure that there is not a father or mother in the community who will say that their children are guilty of these misdemeanors but we know that some father's and mother's child is guilty. When we correct a child, boy or girl of teen age, they will tell their father or mother and then we are reprimanded because they know their child is not the one guilty of tearing seats or destroying property. Therefore, we are at a loss to understand how to operate the theatre. We cannot continue, fix the seats as they are destroyed as they cost too much money to replace. If the families are not going to come to the theatre because children make a lot of noise, that will cost us a loss in revenue, so we are open for suggestions from the fathers and mothers of Ozona and the communities surrounding for steps to take to correct this very bad situation in this theatre.

Now it is a fact that we are going to find out who is cutting the seats sooner or later, but every time we ask some boy if he did and he says he has not and will not tell us who is cutting them,

that shows we are not getting any cooperation from anybody. It has been suggested by several of the citizens that we start barring these suspicious characters from the show until we have barred enough of them that the cutting and destroying has been stopped. In order to do this it will be necessary to bar some innocent person who will have to take the blame as well as the person who is really guilty. This seems like an unfair procedure, but on the other hand, if they are not going to tell you who is cutting the seats and they undoubtedly know, they are equally as guilty as those cutting the seats and should suffer the same penalty. We want to stop those who are actually doing the damage to this theatre. We think the guilty persons are between 14 and 17 years of age.

The seats are in the theatre for inspection by any father or mother who would care to come in and see them. Also we can show you pictures drawn on the backs of the chairs with lipstick. This will get on your clothes and when you get home and discover this it will cause a bad feeling toward the theatre.

Since we cannot get any cooperation there is nothing else for us to do except start a list of names of people whom we think are responsible, or partly responsible, and let them seek their entertainment elsewhere. 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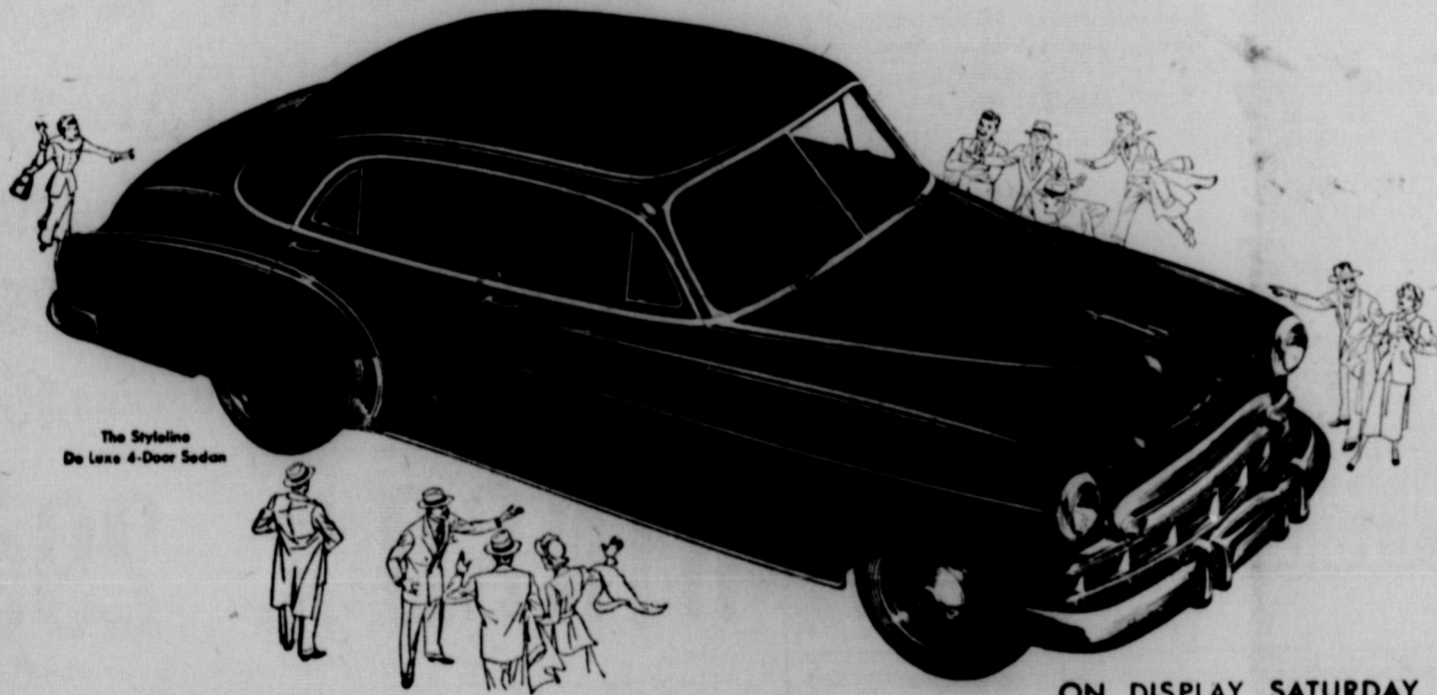

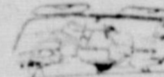
