



### Texas Oil Industry Blasts Federal Curbs To Help Coal States

DALLAS-The use of federal government regulations to curb the competition that Texas petroleum is giving coal in the East and North was criticized by R. B. Anderson, president of the Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association, in a speech before the national convention of Theta Sigma Phi, women's journalism fraternity here Monday.

In a luncheon session of the convention devoted to "Oil is News," Anderson outlined the way in which the economic welfare of Texas is dependent on an annual income of more than \$2,000, 000,000 (billions) a year from the sale of petroleum and products.

"The prosperity of any region is in direct proportion to the amount of goods and services it can contribute to the national economy," Anderson said in a prepared speech.
