

The Texas Department of Pub lic Safety has set as its goal lesthan 1.949 traffic deaths in 1949. If not more than 162 persons are killed this month it will mean a saving in human lives of 50 over the same period last year and this, alone, would effect a 21/25 reduction for the entire year.
