January Temperature Readings Range From 20 to 81 Degrees

January's weather in Ozona presents a confusing picture when you examine the temperature readings on the U. S. Weather Bureau instrument being maintained here at the fire station. The temperature readings rang-

ed from a crisp 20 degrees on the tenth of January to a sweltering 81 degrees four days later. The 81 degree high followed a period of eight straight days when minimum readings were below the 32 degree freezing point, the low readings reached in early morning hours. The month's average maximum reading was 68.8 degrees and the minimum average 40.7 degrees. The month's average temperature was 54.7. Except for the shower or driz-






