# **All-Time Peak Water Use Record** Set Here in July

## 28 Million Gallons Flow Thru Mains

To Tax Pumps While many cities and towns in shortages and rationing, Ozonans set an all-time record in water usage during the past dry month of the local water system, but the city has experienced no shortage

A total of 28,443,000 gallons of water works hill to set a new record for one month's water usage,

The July, 1951, record consumption was over a million gallons tablished in August, 1948, when an estomated 27 million gallons went through the system. The master meter had not been installed at that time and the estimate was arrived at by totalling the month's

#### Hickman Wins Prize In "Ism" Definition Contest of Newspaper

Rev. J. Troy Hickman, pastor of the Ozona Methodist Church, won second place and a \$5 cash prize in the San Angelo Standard-Times "ism" definition contest concluded this week. The newspaper offered cash prizes for the best definition of Democracy, Socialism and Communism. Exton Talley, San Angelo print shop operator, won first prize.

Rev. Hickman's definitions of the three "isms" follow:

A democracy is that way of life which, in disregard of the accidents of birth, assigns to each individual an inherent value: regards him as equal to all but sufunction in a superior or inferior way; holds him responsible for himself and for his contribution to the common good; undertakes to secure to him the maximum opportunity to realize his potential and enjoy as much freedom as may be consistent with the welfare of the group; and rewards him materially in proportion to his productiveness.

Socialism is a way of life which seeks gradually and by legal process to vest the ownership and control of all productive resources in the state, and to distribute the profits thereof to all citiezns on a basis of theoretical equality or right, rather than proportionally to those whose properties, ideas or efforts produced them.



A report need be made only if cash wages of \$50 or more were paid to a houshold worker, who worked during all or part of 24 days (twice a week) between April 1 and June 30. If more than one person worked in a home, each is to be considered separately. Room and board do not count as wages.

Generally speaking household workers for purpose of the Social Security law are maids, laundresses, cooks, housekeepers, baby-sitters, nursemaids, practical nurses, gardners, handymen, chaffers.

A simple envelope report form has been devised to facilitate the reporting for the ladies. All the information necessary to making the report is the social security number of the employee, and the total amount of the wages paid in the quarter. One and one-half per cent of the wages should be paid by each the employee and the employer, making a total of three per ceent of the wages to be included with the report. When the


