**Emergency Roughages
Being Used to Feed
Cattle During Drouth**

COLLEGE STATION. — Texas
livestock men are searching far
and wide for roughages to feed
their cattle this winter. They have
been importing hay from the Mid-
west since last July.

This search has uncovered several
emergency roughage materials.
Some of these are low in
quality but may be used if fed
with other roughages of higher
quality and a protein supplement
such as cottonseed meal.

John H. Jones, animal husband-
man with the Texas Agricultural
Experiment Station, reports that
corn-cob-and-shuck meal, ground
peanut hulls, dehydrated green
cotton stalks and gin trash are
some of the emergency roughages
now being fed.

The gin trash being used is free
of dirt and consists of cotton burs,

leaf trash, small amounts of im-
mature seed and lint. Samples of
gin trash have shown from 8 to
12 percent crude protein.

Most of the corn cobs and
shucks in Central Texas have been
ground into meal for roughage,"
says Jones. "Although this feed
has a low protein content, it has
more fattening value than most
of the other emergency rough-
ages. It makes a good bulky kind
of feed suitable as a carrier for
cottonseed meal."

Ground peanut hulls are low in
protein and very high in crude fi-
ber. Grinding improves the hulls
for feeding, and they may be used
as part of the filler for cattle. A
commonly used mixture consists
of 40 per cent ground peanut hulls,
40 per cent cottonseed hulls and
20 per cent cottonseed meal.

One of the most promising e-
mergency roughages is dehydrated
green cotton stalks. The prepara-
tion of this material resulted from
a scarcity of alfalfa for dehydra-
tion and the urgent need for feed.
Green, leafy cotton stalks were a-
vailable, and Joe Variaco of Col-
lege Station was able to prepare
a small tonnage of dehydrated
cotton stalk material before frost.

Analysis of a sample of the de-
hydrated cotton stalks at the
State Chemist's Laboratory show-
ed a crude protein content of 10.35
per cent and a nitrogen-free ex-
tract content of 45.66 per cent.
The material has good quality,
color and smell.

Variaco gave several sacks of
the dehydrated stalks to the Ex-
periment Station. J. E. Roberts,
superintendent of the Main Sta-
tion Farm at College Station, re-
ports that cattle eat the material
very readily.

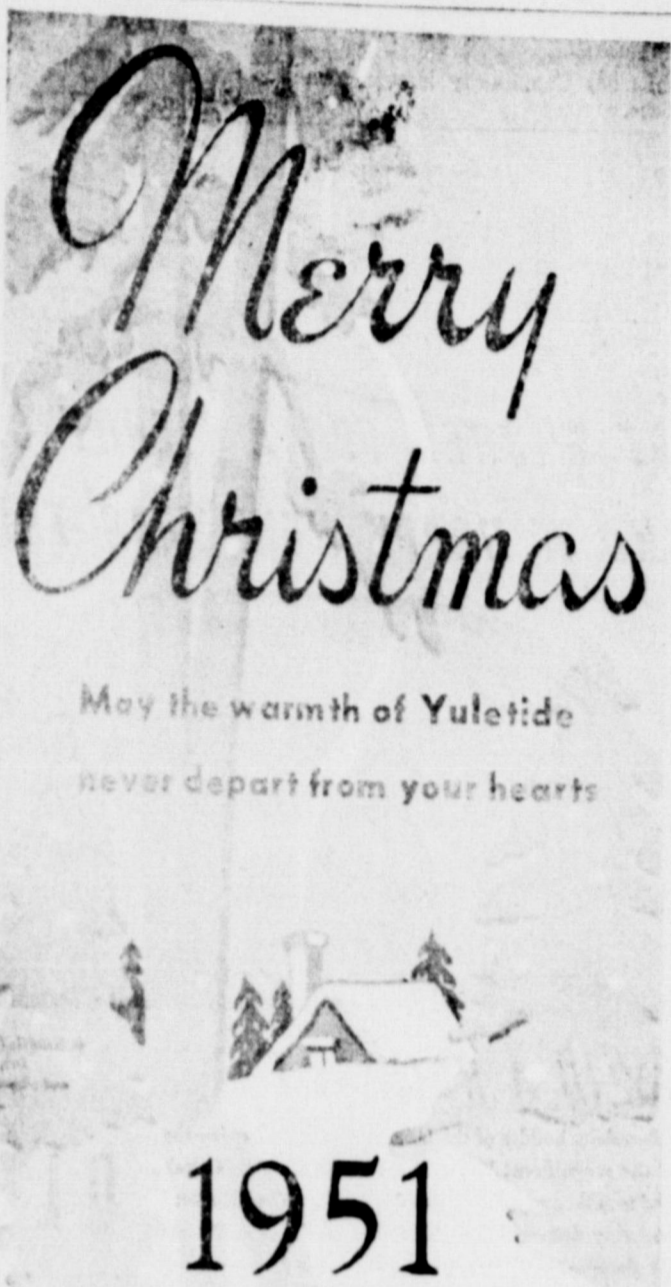

Seek to Improve Oil Recovery by Chemistry

AUSTIN, Texas. Improvement of oil recovery by chemical methods is the goal of two University of Texas researchers. William W. Holland is investigating petroleum engineering aspects of the methods, and Dr. L. O. Morgan is working on basic chem-

ical techniques. The scientists are searching for two groups of chemicals: one which will allow water to flow more freely through a petroleum bearing formation, and another to hold water in a reservoir while oil is produced.

1951 TAXES NOW DUE

December Last Month To Earn Discount

Your 1951 county, state and school taxes are now due and payable.

Except for school taxes, the same discount schedule for prompt payment as in previous years will be in effect this year. The discount will not be allowed on school taxes, but on county and state portions of the total tax bill, a discount of 2 per cent will be allowed in November, 1 per cent in December.

If you mail in your tax remittance, deduct the amount of allowable discount, taking only the county and state portion of your taxes for computing the deduction. No discount may be taken from your school tax or poll tax.
