Castilleja Gets 25-Year Sentence On Murder Charge

Sonora Charged in Slaying of Miguel Gonzales

Ben Castilleja, Sonora shearing capitan, drew a 25-year sentence in the state penitentiary at the hands of a Crockett county jury in 112h district court here Tuesday on a charge of murder with mal-

Castilleja was charged with the fatal shooting of Miguel Gonzales in Sonora on August 19, 1951. He was tried in Sonora and assessed inal Apeaks., and was transferred of this county on change of venue.

The state presented only five witnesses, the widow of the murdered man, Joe Espinosa, Zaragosa Sanchez, Sheriff B. W. Hutcherson of Sutton county, and Glen Crites, Sonora undertaker. The defense introduced no testimony, resting its case immediately after conclusion of the state's testimony.

The state relied principally on the testimony of Sheriff Hutche-Deep Test on Shannon son and Sanchez. Sanchez testified that he saw Castilleja standing by a pickup in which Gonzales was seated, saw the defendant make a beckoning motion to Gonzales and say, "Follow me."
