The Crockett County 4-H Club Wool and Mohair Judging Team placed fifth in the State Contest held at San Angelo Junior College in San Angelo last week. The team made a good showing in the upper bracket of the contest which had fourteen teams competing. Competition was keen with little variation in scores. The Crockett county team was beaten by Menard county by only one point and in turn beat out the Schleicher county team by the small margin of one point.

Scores were also close among the local team members. Tom Robison was the team's high man with a score of 578, followed by Joe Everett with 575, Brock Jones 574, and R. J. Everett with 562. Tom, Joe and R. J. ranked 15th, 16th, and 17th, respectively in overall competition.

Bandera County 4-H won the contest with a team score of 1893 points followed by Sonora with 1825, Runnels county with 1735, Menard county 1728, and Crockett county 1727.

The Crockett county team previously won the District 6 Judging Contest at Sul Ross College in Alpine with Tom Robison taking third high individual award honors.
