#### Autumnal Equinox Occurs Today

For a brief moment today the sun in its elliptical course will be directly over the celestial equator. This happens twice in the year, on March 21 and on September 23. It is called equin ox from "aequus" for equal and "nox" for night. On these occassions days and nights are of equal length, except for the fact that the vernal or spring equinox has a way of arriving about 20 minutes earlier each year than it did the year before.

People sometimes say that weather disturbances may be expected on or near the equinox. Encyclopedia Brittanica says this is not true. Scientific weather observations made for 50 consecutive years, according to this authority, showed fewer the equinox than in ordinary






