





Forth Worth - A definite trend to early Summer cattle marketing has developed in recent weeks, and on Monday the evidence of this situation was very clear. Cowmen are culling their herds eatlier than usual in all of Texas' major cow

The day's cattle and calves numbered about 8,000, the biggest day's offering since last November. The run included the smallest supply of grainfed beef this year, and the percentage of aged cows and bulls in the run was largest since

On Monday, drylot grainfed teers and vearlings of good and choice kinds were fully steady some weighty yearlings stronger

50 cents lower. Choice stockers scarce and mostly steady. Plainer steckers around \$1 lower, some common kinds off more.

Fat Spring lambs lost 50 cents o \$1 at Fort Worth Monday and born lambs were around \$1 lower. Older sheep sold about in line with last week's close. Breeding ewes were finding good outlets when they were suitable ages and

had quality. Reports late last week from the Eastern Seaboard told of sizable supplies of lamb that was rather poor condition and had to be sold under distress conditions there There was also some talk that quantities of lamb there would have to be taken to freezers be cause outlets were clogged.

This situation might last from a few to a week or more. Usually up in a week or less, and by the prices should be more stable.





Captan New Killer Black Spot On Roses

College Station, - Rose growers troubled by black spot on rose leaves will welcome captan-a new effective control. This new substance added to a spray is a sure control for the number one enemy of roses.

Black spot first appears on rose leaves as tiny dark spots which spread and kill the leaf. It may also cause leaves to turn yellow and drop off. The loss of leaves weakens the plant and single flowers or pale flowers may form. Black spots causes die-back which begins at the bloom and runs all the way down to the roots.

Sadie Hatfield, homestead improvement specialist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. says roses need to be treated withn 24 hours after every rain. When he weather remains cloudy for a long period, roses should be sprayed once every ten days.




