CCC Wool Stockpile Not To Be Dumped On Market At Cut Price

San Angelo - The U. S. Department of Agriculture has announced that the present minimum selling price for wool owned by the Commodity Credit Corporation will be continued until November 1, according to a wire received by R. W. Hodge, President, Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Associa-

"This is a policy that we and the National Wool Growers Association have been working for since it was announced that the Defense Depriment would not use any of these wools for use in manufacture and storing of cloth" Hodge added.

"It is hoped that this announcement will tend to help the wool market in general as the 1955 clip is now moving into the warehousees in Texas. These CCC wools have been hanging over the market and naturally depress it."

Penrose B. Metcalfe, Vice-pre sident of the National Wool Grow ers Association and a past president of the TS&GRA, spent considerable time in Washington in April with other officers of the National Wool Growers Association on this problem, Hodge said.
