



Unprecedent Demand For Feeder Animals Looms

Bumper crops of feed being produced in most sections of the country portend heavy livestock feeding operations in the next few months. Concentration will be on hogs and cattle, with heavy poultry operations likely also.

USDA officials in Washington are reported highly concerned over the whole price support program. Seems that last year only about 35 per cent of the crop went into the program. About the same figure appears destined to be sealed this year.

They say that at laest 45 to 50 per cent should be in the program, or it cannot work. It is a case of the tail trying to wag the dog when such a small per cent of the producers cooperate in the loan and support program.

Situation is aggravated by huge barley, oats, grain sorghum crops. Sov beans in excessive supply, the last estimate on cotton indicated more protein there than anticipat-

Professional feeders, who buy everything are expected to slow operations if the situation remains the same. However, farmers with feed stuffs are expected to market it as meat or poultry.




