USING THE LAND WISELY

West Texas ranchmen, many of them for the first time in their lives, are acutely conscious today got out of banks as the result of grass; are able to identify many of the difference species and have knowledge of the relative importance of each in the operation of livestock ranches, and are striving to restore nature's balance in grasses and other vegetation for maximum productivity of the land.

The drouth, of course, has been largely responsible for this awareness of the important role grass plays in the economics of West Texas. Ranchmen have always been conscious, more or less, of the grass on their ranges, but for many of them the condition of their ranges was summed up in an appraisal expressed as "green," "good feed," "greening up," "burned up," or "bare."

Nowadays, many ranchmen can tell you what percentage of "climax grasses" have survived on their ranges; they have experimented with introduced grasses; they have practiced some kind of range conservation with an eve to restoring the productivity of the land, once the rains come again with fair regularity. The ranchman has become convinced, too, that it is going to take more than ordinary care to restore that range. even if the rainfall becomes "nor mal" again. He has seen in recent months some nice rains, which a few years ago would have put him in good shape for the summer, but he has observed that there are still many bare places
