But there is always the fear of a collision, especially at an intersection. The rule in most cities is that when you hear a siren or see a blinking light coming toward you from from or rear, you should pull to the curb and stop. This, of course, clears the way of moving traffic and moving traffic is what the fire engine driver fears. Keep the interesections clear, by all means, until all trucks and firemen have passed. Citizens might help by assuming traffic duty at intersections where the trucks are going to pass, keeping cars back well away from the intersection so the trucks can turn either





Owners of trailers of over 4,000 pounds who have not secured a serial number must do so before the trailer can be registered. Application forms are available at the office.




