Taxes By Paying In October

County, State and School Taxes will be due and payable beginning October 1. As in previous years, a scale of discounts for early payment will be in effect this year. Discounts will be allowed only on state and county taxes, none on school taxes. Discount schedule is as follows:

> 3% If Paid in October 2% If Paid in November 1% If Paid in December


