

Cattle Bally After Last Week's Dip

FORT WORTH — Trade was active and prices were fully steady to 25 or 50 cents higher at Fort Worth Monday. Trade was spotty, with all sales not reflecting the advance, but the tone of the trade was much better throughout.

Dressed meat trade reports reflected continued stable outlets for the red meat, and stocker and feeder demand continued to expand. Comparative prices: Slaughter steers and yearlings of good and choice grades \$19 to \$22.50, high choice quotable to \$24.00. Medium and low grade butchers were sold from \$12 to \$18. Fat cows \$12 to \$14, and canners and cutters brought \$8.50 to \$12. Bulls drew \$10 to \$15.50.

Good and choice fat calves sold from \$18.50 to \$22, and medium and lower grades \$12 to \$18. Stock-calves and yearlings \$18 to \$22.

Lambs Weaken, Trade Highly Uneven, Top \$24.

Trade on sheep and lambs was highly uneven at Fort Worth Monday. Shippers topped a few fancy Springers out at \$23 and \$24 early in the day. Later bids were 50 cents to \$1 lower and in a slow trade a part of this decline was effective and part of it was not.

Quality of the lambs in the run, aside from a few tops, was not so good as it has been. This factor, coupled with wet fleeces, served to offset a good part of what looked like sharply lower bids.





told that a watch was being kept on the draw and asked to prepare to evacuate on signal from the fire siren.




