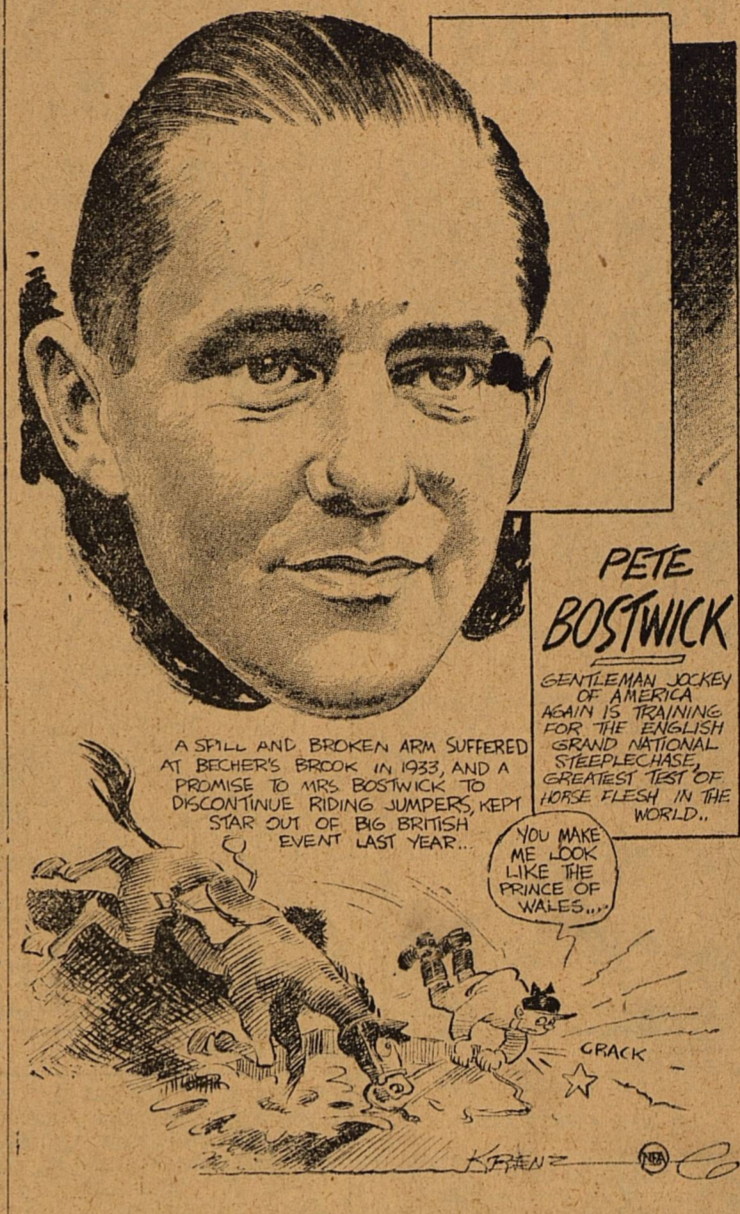
**Deduction for Contributions**  
Charitable contributions and gifts made by an individual are deductible within limitations provided by the revenue act. The organization to which the gift is made must meet several tests. The corporation, trust, community chest, fund, or foundation, must be operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes, or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals; and if a substantial part of its activities is carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, it fails to pass the tests. No part of the organization's income may inure to the benefit of any private stockholder or individual.

Contributions made to a missionary fund, church building fund, and for the benefit of other activities of the church are deductible. Pew rents, assessments, and dues paid to churches are regarded as contributions. Gifts to a corporation or association organized, or devoted to the advancement of learning are deductible.

Gifts to an individual are not deductible, but if made to a charitable organization, as defined by the revenue act, may be deducted even though the organization distributes funds among the individual beneficiaries.

Contributions made to the United States, the District of Columbia, any State or Territory or political subdivision thereof, such as a city or town, for exclusively public purposes, are deductible; for example, a gift of real estate to a city to be used perpetually as a public park is deductible. Also allowable are contributions to the special fund for vocational rehabilitation, to posts or

office purposes, a proportionate amount of the depreciation sustained may be deducted, based generally on the ratio of the number of rooms used for such purposes to the total number of rooms in the building. The same principle applies if a taxpayer rents to others a portion of his residence. Under such conditions, however, the taxpayer must include in his gross income the rentals received.

### Galveston to Have Red Cross School

GALVESTON, (AP)—Invitation to hold a statewide Red Cross school in first aid and life saving training in Galveston during the summer has been accepted by the local Red Cross chapter.

Dates for the schools have not been set but it is expected to be held some time in June. Decision to hold the school here was made after a communication had been received from the National Red Cross headquarters.

Many persons from over the state are expected to attend. The school will last one week and after four basic courses—swimming, life-saving, first aid and boating. Courses will be run two hours with eight hours of class work each day.

Representatives from the national association will be here to conduct the school. A small enrollment fee will be charged. Training schools are being opened this year in Michigan, Colorado and Texas by the national association.

### Razor Home 315 Year Old

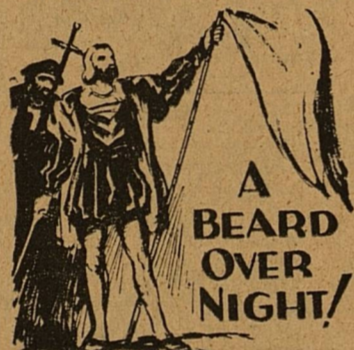
