

Decision Is Expected After Troubles With Foes

CLIMAX TO DUEL

Gives Up After Eight Months Constant Bickering

PARIS, Jan. 22, (P).—Premier Laval's government went down in defeat today as he and his ministers resigned in the face of political dissension. Laval had held the office since June 1935, a comparatively long time in recent French history. The resignation climaxed a long political fued in which Edouard Herriot, minister of state, resigned the presidency of the Radical-Socialists and later withdrew support from nd later withdrew support from

One reason for the hostility of the left wing was Laval's handling of the Italo-Ethiopian problem with what was described as vacillation between Italy and Britain. It is believed that Laval will re-fuse to form another cabinet.

Although \$100,000,000 has been spent the three decades to bring that area, the Lower Rio Grande Valley of Texas, into fruition, corresponding lands on the Mexican side of the river remained comparatively dormant. Such development as coccurred has been confined to dry land growing of cotton and corn.

Meixco's Lower Rio Grande Valley, however, is starting a new page in its history and this year will see a change in the picture south of the river. Roberto Garcia, mayor of Matamoros, is back from Mexico City with the amnouncement that 10,000,000 pesos have been appropriated to finance a gigantic flood control program extending from a point east of Matamoros more than 100 miles to Camargo at the northwest.






