JACKSON, Miss., March 29. (P). Mississippi called out its national guard last night in a war-like hunt for a man believed to be Raymond Hamilton, Texas death cell fugitive and No: 1 desperado of the Southwest, and another bandit who blazed a trail of terror and banditry through south Mississippi yesterday

The two bandits roared through several counties in stolen automobiles, wounded two persons, engaged in several gun battles, disarmed a posse of 15 men and kidnaped at least six persons in their mad flight after robbing a bank of g. Adjutant - General Thomas L.

Adjutant - General Thomas L. Grayson, national guard commander, said the men, with one hostage, were last seen turning off into a gravel road three miles west of Georgetown in Copiah county, only about 25 miles from the scene of the bank holdup.

Guns barked repeatedly within a 50-mile radius of Prentiss during the day as the two men zig-zagged their way from one highway to another at breakneck speed. Officers from practically all south Mississippi counties joined in the chase and last night the highway department had blocked off a quadrangular area in which the men were believed trapped. Armed posses patrolled every road in the section.

One bandit, a youthful "blondhaired man," was reported peppered in the face with a squirrel shot by a farmer, J. T. Polk, who resisted an attempt the bandits made to commandeer his automobile.
