It is an interesting plan which the Nunn-Bush shoe factory of Milwaukee has established for its 700 workers.

The size of the checks, of course, will depend on the company's income. Workers and management have reached an agreement as to the percentage of each dollar's income which is to go to pay checks, and a fixed proportion of profits will be set aside and distributed as a bonus when business is good.

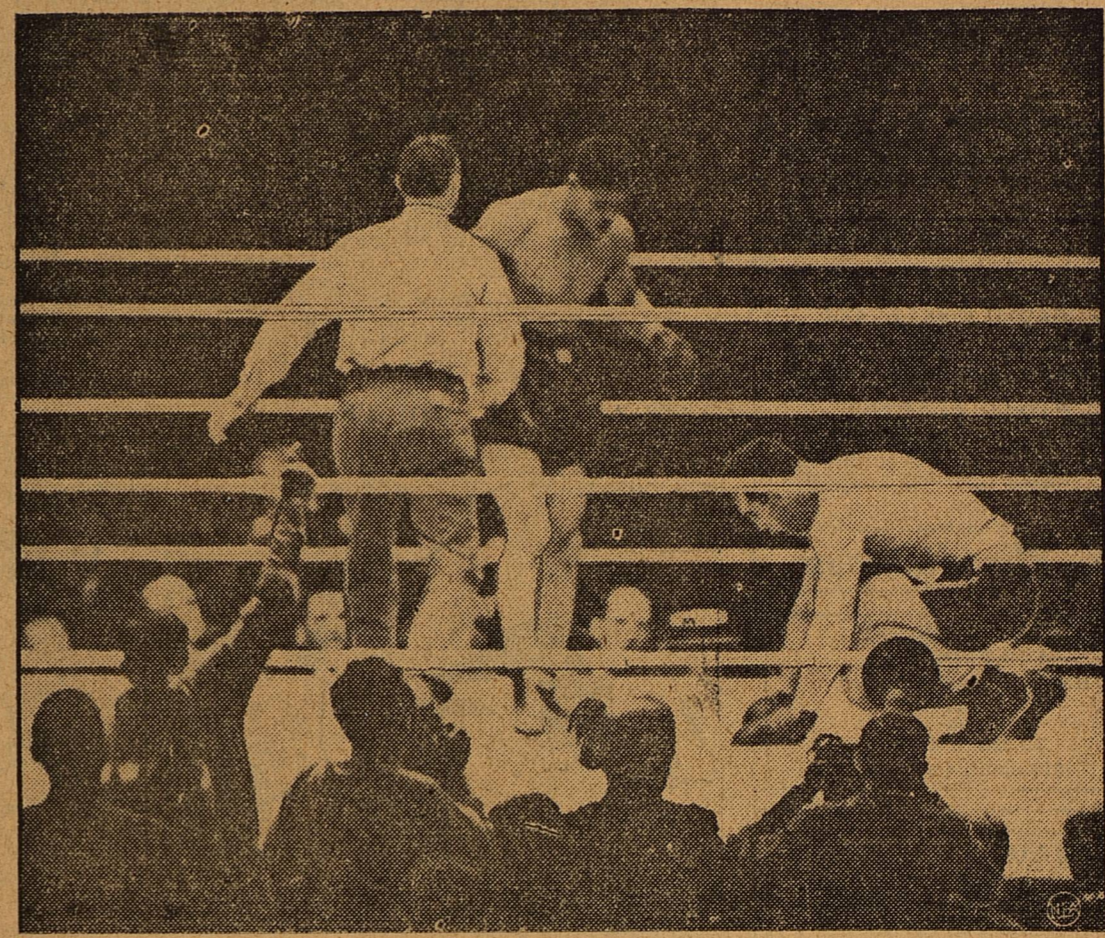

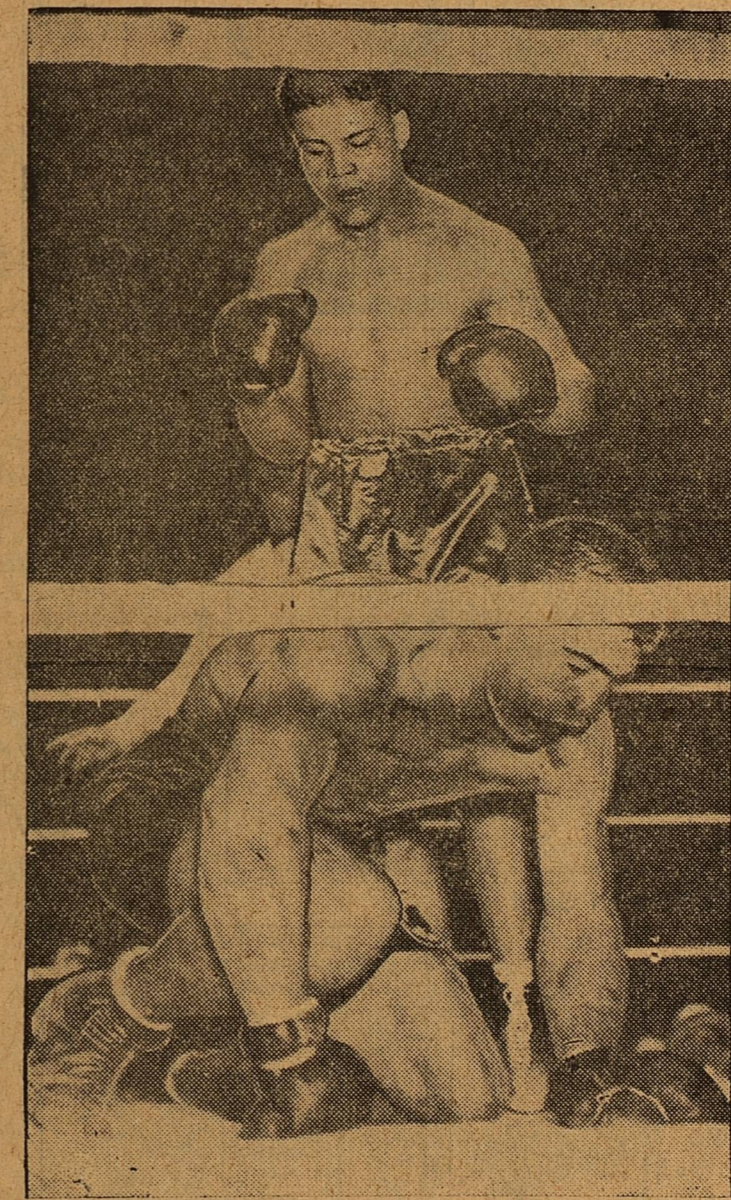
