### Change Dove Seasons In Fourteen States

WASHINGTON. - Federal open

WASHINGTON.—Federal open seasons on mourning doves have been changed in 14 States by amendments to the Migratory Bird Treaty Act regulations adopted by Secretary Wallace and approved by President Roosevelt.

The changes were recommended by the Biological Survey to obtain better cooperation with State and local agencies in enforcement of Federal game laws and, in some cases, to curtail dove shooting during State seasons on quall. Though more satisfactory to the sportsmen and local enforcement agencies, the new regulations provide for fewer days of hunting than formerly allowed and are thus expected to further dove conservation this year in a two-fold way.



# SUPREME COURT **AUTHORIZES SUIT AGAINST TAX ACT**

Constitutionality of Discounts to Be Tested

AUSTIN, Oct. 1. (P).—The supreme court today authorized the filing of a suit to test the constitutionality of an act offering discounts for prompt payment of state ad valorem taxes.

It granted the Rowan Drilling Company leave to file suit asking for a mandamus directing Comptroller George Sheppard to accept the payment of \$200 in taxes under House Bill 6 of the regular session, which proposed the reductions.



France today unexpectedly ordered military maneuvers and strengthened their German borders as Germany's withdrawal from the League of Nations, set for October 21st, approached.

France was reported to be seeking British aviation help against any German threat. In return, the French would reinforce the British Mediterranean fleet in the event of Italo-British trouble.

It was believed that Emperor Selassie might order mobilization this week. The Italian minister at Addis Ababa ordered five Italian consulates in the Audwa and Harar provinces to evacuate immediately. Italian sources called Ethiopia's impending mobilization a "menacing threat" for war. They said that Italy's east African army was braced against any Ethiopian attack.

George Lansbury, aged leader of the Labor party in the British House of Commons, repudiated the party policy for military sanctions in the event of aggression in the Italo-Ethiopian conflict.
