50,000 WILL PAY TO SEE LEVINSKY AND LOUIS FIGHT

CHICAGO, Aug. 7. (AP)—Fifty thousand spectators will pay \$200,000 tonight to see Joe Louis, the Detroit Bomber, can take it like King Levinsky.

In a ring pitched over the pitcher's box at Comiskey Park, home of the Chicago White Sox, Louis, winner of spectacular knockouts in 23 professional bouts, will meet Levinsky, Chicago's eccentric but powerful wallop, in a battle scheduled for 10 rounds or less.

Not since 1927, when Jack Dempsey and Gene Tunney fought before a record breaking crowd in Soldier's Field, has there been such a rallying to a fight in Chicago.

indebtedness incurred in connection with the purchase of land for agricultural uses, provided the loans are eligible in other respects and the applicants can show the required equity in their properties and are in satisfactory financial condition.

"One of the principal reasons for using bonds in lieu of cash in making land bank and Commissioner's loans," Mr. Williams said, "was to get a wide distribution of the bonds throughout the country and small towns as well as in the cities. About 425,000 loans have been made since the Corporation came into existence. These bonds have been very well received by the public in general and the farmers' creditors in particular. In fact, during much of the time in which they have been in existence they have sold at above par.

The interest rate on new Federal Land Bank Loans is now four per cent per annum and loans by the Land Bank Commissioner bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum. A temporary reduction of interest on Federal Land Bank loans having installments due prior to July 1, 1935, was put into effect July 1, 1935. This was the result of new legislation, The Farm Credit Act of 1935, which was signed by President Roosevelt June 3, and reduced the interest rate to 3 1/2 per cent for interest payable in the one year period, commencing July 1, 1935, and to four per cent for all interest payable in the two year period commencing July 1, 1936. Interest payable on installment dates occurring after July 30, 1938, will be at the original contract rate of the loans. These loans are payable over a long period of time and on convenient terms.
