### MISD expected to decide on open/closed campuses

The Muleshoe Independent School District Board of Trustees will meet Monday, May 23 at 7 p.m. at the Administration Building.

The board is expected to discuss and take action on the district's policy on open/closed campuses at lunchtime at DeShazo Elementary and Watson Junior High School.

The board will also consider the Region XVII Educational Service Center contract for instructional media, consider the continued participation in Texas Purchasing Consortium and discuss the revision of the Texas Education Code.

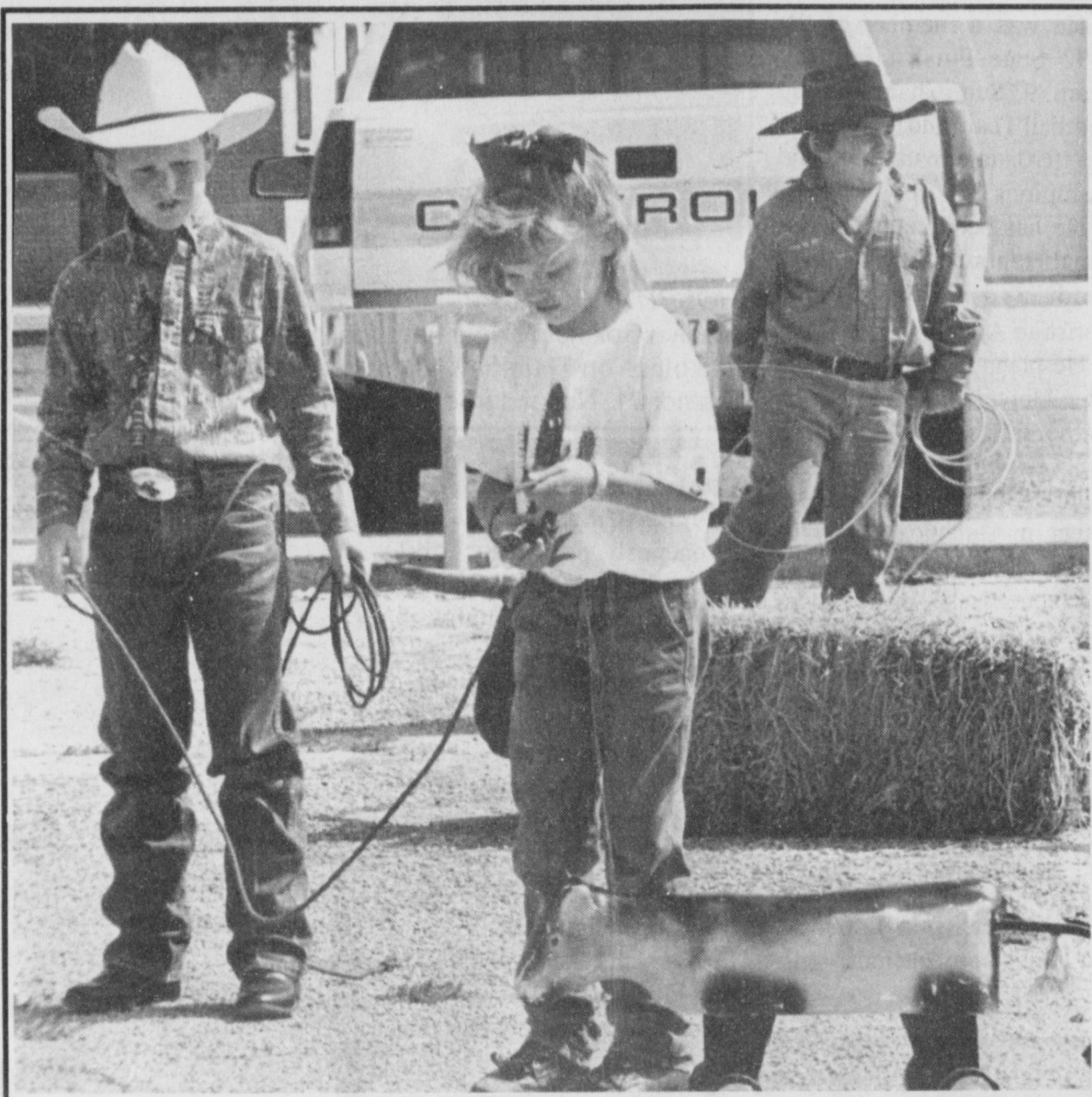
The board will also discuss a resolution for Superintendent of the year nomination. Following an executive session, the board will consider hiring a new middle school principal and other professional staff.

In high school, she has received awards in Spanish I, she received a 2nd place award in district UIL news writing and a 2nd place award in district UIL in regional ready writing.

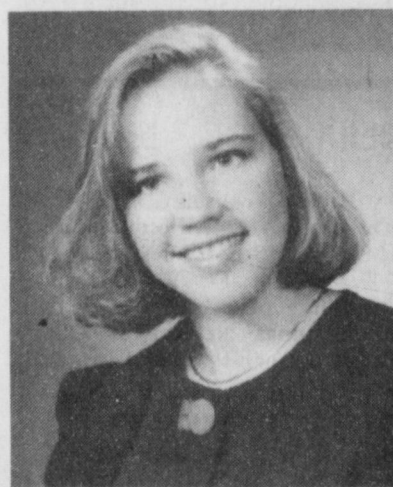
She plans to attend Texas A & M University and study journalism.

Quintana is the daughter of David and Margaret Quintana.

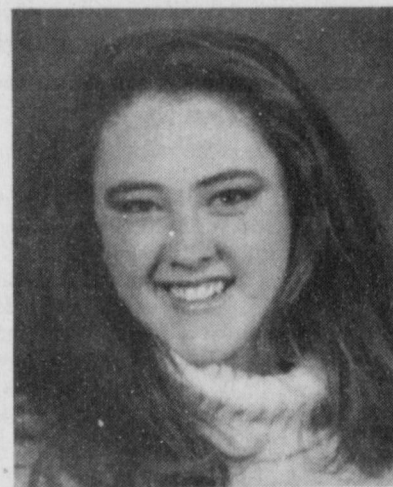
She has been active in tennis, regionals, varsity track, region 3, one act play, state 2 regionals and was best actress.

Awards she has received throughout high school include Algebra I, high school Algebra II, trigonometry, Spanish I, physics, theatre II,



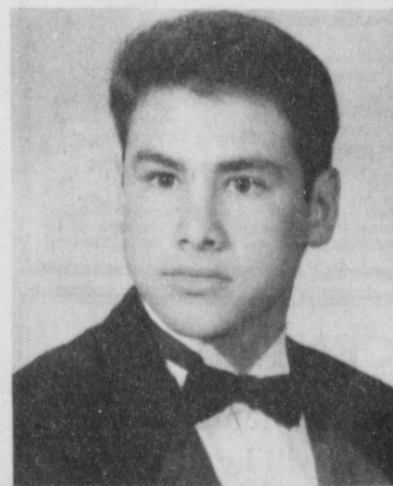

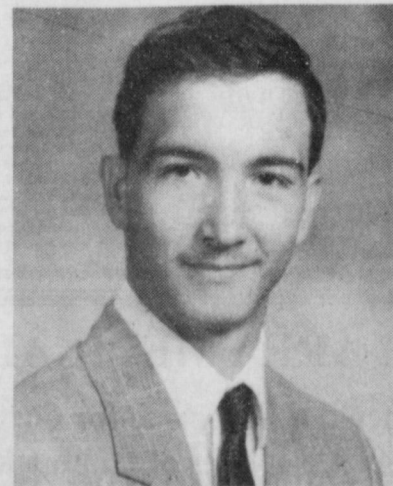

She plans to attend the University of Texas at Austin and major in engineering.

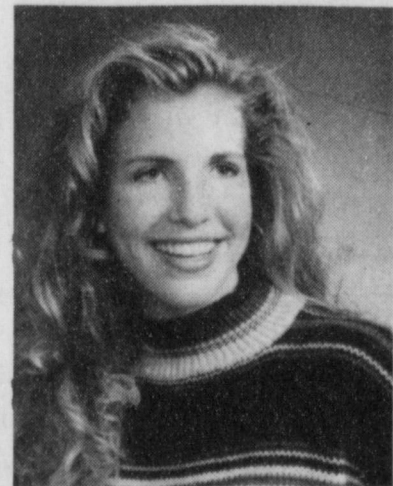

# Grand master visits local lodge

On Thursday, May 12, Howard Holmes, Grand Master of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of Texas, made an official visit to the Muleshoe Lodge #58.

All of the Rebekahs and Odd Fellows of the surrounding area were invited to the open house. Holmes said that was the largest crowd he had addressed in a lodge hall since his elevation from deputy grand master to Grand Master, the highest post. He was elevated in Abilene on March 21, 1990.

Les Lambert gave the invocation after the dinner. Past noble grand called the meeting to order and introduced Holmes.

Holmes had just returned from Washington, where on Memorial Day, he layed a wreath on the base of the grave of the Unknown Soldier. Holmes said that the Odd Fellows is the only fraternal organization that was given this privilege.

While there are some legends that give the name "Odd Fellows" a history dating back to ancient Rome or even the Egyptian Pharaohs, the organization has documents which date back to the early 18th century.

Until that time, only the aristocracy had established philanthropic societies. It was unheard of that common men would organize a mutual aid fraternity.

Holmes said Odd Fellows and Rebekahs are working together to advance eye research through the professorships in ophthalmology at the Wilmer Ophthalmological Institute at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore.

Another subject he mentioned was the Texas Visual Assistance Program and World Eye Bank. The Texas Visual Assistance Program provides eye glasses, minor eye surgery and visual aids such as magnifying glasses and high-intensity lights to needy.

The fraternity also supports the United Nations Pilgrimage for Youth, the Kidney Foundation, Gifts of Life Organ Donor Program, a nursing home in Ennis, and the Arthritis Foundation.

Holmes also mentioned a number of other projects the fraternity is involved with.



**Is Your God Too Small?**



God who would never bother his worshippers with the demands of real commitment but is always there available to fill every "felt need."

Then, when we come in the church door chilled by the ice-cold clutch of reality, the questions are different. We're no longer asking, "What slick programs do you offer to make my already easy life easier? What can the church do for me for free, for no commitment? By the way, can you point me to your Family Life Center's sauna?"

No, the question becomes, "Can you point me to the One who is big enough to carry my burdens and give my life meaning and direction? Can we walk together in love as fellow strugglers when life tumbles in and I have no social status, no money, nothing to barter for your love? Can we bow together confessing our deep need and reaching out to take the bleeding hand of the only One who can really lead us through the journey?"

If your God isn't the God who faced a cross to help you bear your own, your God is too small.

While folks in my generation, the "baby-boomers," certainly have their strengths, one of our weaknesses as a group is that we tend to be frightened of commitment. # Irrigation system video can help save money for producers

Water for crops is the main limiting factor of agriculture on the Texas High Plains. Irrigation, especially with center pivots, has increased productivity dramatically for this rich agricultural region. LEPA irrigation systems save money for producers and water re-

sources for future generations of producers.

A video on LEPA irrigation systems is now available for producers, landowners and anyone interested in water conservation. "LEPA--Saving Water for Future Producers" presents the various aspects of

LEPA center pivots for producers to consider to be more informed consumers. The 30 minute video incorporates interviews with 18 producers and experts from the High Plains talking about their experiences with LEPA.

Instead of spraying water

high in the air, newer center pivots called LEPA, or Low Energy, Precision Application, deliver water directly to plants. LEPA systems have nozzles spaced to the ground, drops spaced closer together, and much lower operating pressure so that they save on operating

costs.

More than just hardware, LEPA is an irrigation and tillage management systems designed to eliminate nearly all evaporation losses. A properly designed and managed system incorporating all the technology is 98 percent efficient.

The video was a joint project produced by Pam Alspaugh, Video Services, Office of News and Publications at Texas Tech University with grant funds from the Water Resources Center of the Texas Tech University College of Engineering.
