No Aid For States This Year From Social Security Board

REPORTED TO HAVE GIVEN UP PLANS TO HELP IN 1935
Left Without Money By Huey Long's Filibuster

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27. (AP)—The new social security board was reported today to have given up plans to grant aid to states this year for old age pensions and other phases of the social security program.

AIR DERBYISTS GREETED BY LARGE CROWD HERE MON.

Air-minded Midland turned out 2,000 strong Monday afternoon to see Ruth Chatterton, film actress, and five of the six contestants in her "Sportsman's Derby" curtain-raiser of the National Air Races to open Friday in Cleveland—zoom across the finish line for the fourth lap here.

Following Ricks were Mrs. Grace Prescott of San Diego, flying a Traveller; Mrs. Sidney H. Ford of Fontana, California, in a Great Lakes Plane and W. S. Woodson of San Diego in a Fleet. Miss Hamilton landed here first after the departure of the other fliers.

The crowd surrounded the plane of Miss Chatterton when she landed and it was several minutes before she could climb out of it. After leaving here yesterday afternoon Ricks was forced down at Colorado with minor trouble and spent the night there.

Points (100 for each lap) are awarded in accordance with each flier's ability to adhere to a designated speed, both excess and slow speeds carrying penalties. Through the four laps to Midland, or out of a possible 400 points, the five contestants graded had the following totals:

Ricks, first, 370.39; Hayward, second, 368.5; Mrs. Sheehy, third, 330.1; Mrs. Grace Prescott, fourth, 327.28; and Woodson, fifth, 228.64.

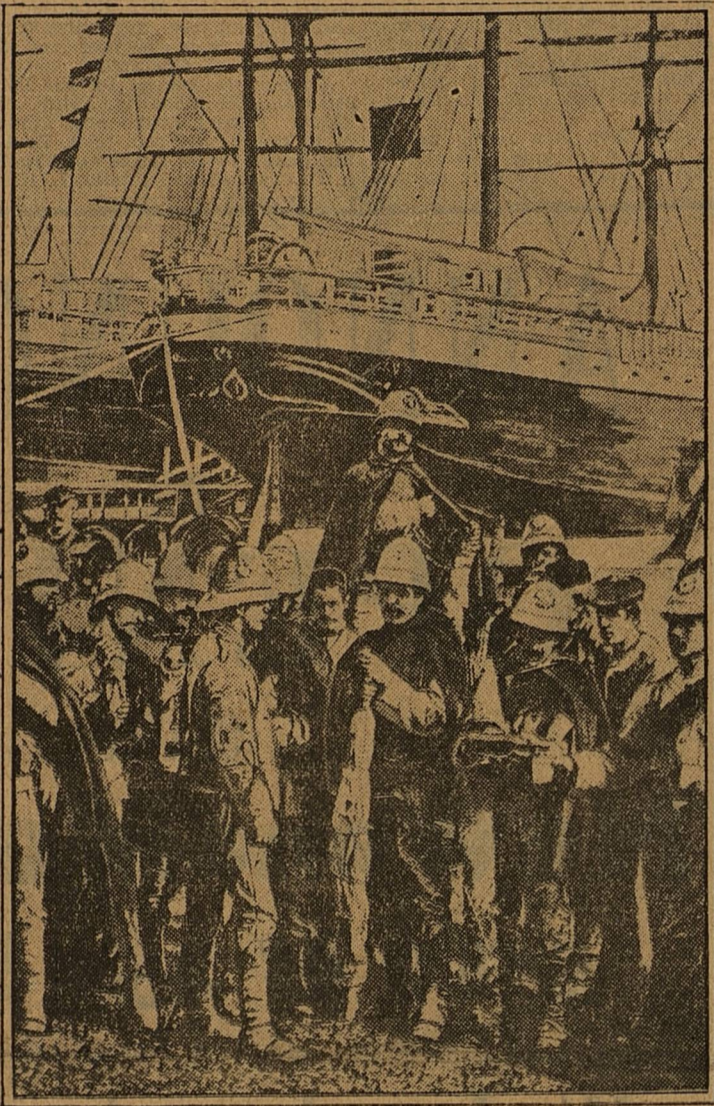
Officials said last night they had not yet been able to compute what penalty, if any, Ricks would be assessed for his forced landing at Colorado.
