Million Dollar Fight Gate Is Certain PRODUCER; MINER REPRESENTATIVES DIFFERING

One and Half Cent Difference Bars Settlement

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24, (P). —
The soft coal strike negotiations weer resumed today with a stumbling block reported to be a difference of one and one-half cents per ton in the pay of the miners.

The producers are standing by their offer of seven and one-half cents per ton while the miners are demanding nine cents.

Relief administration officials said that funds would not be provided for an estimated 400,000 strikers unless actual need occurred and the National Labor Relations board made officials determination of the dispute justifiable.
