BUTTE, Mont., Dec. 26. (P).—
Posses of citizens today searched the western Montana hills for a "cop killer" identified as Harry Knight, ex-convict who killed two persons and wounded two Christmas day.
Policeman Tom O'Neill was killed and a companion officer, James Mooney, was wounded when they were called to a boarding house by residents who reported that Knight had fatally shot Frank Walsh and wounded Mrs. Florence Benevue after being repulsed in efforts to enter the apartment of Mrs. Benevue's sister, Jean Miller.
The killer fled in an automobile. Miss Miller told officers that Knight had also killed Deputy Sheriff Meehan, of Seattle, in November.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26. (P).—President Roosevelt today began work on recommendations to congress, which meets January third. There was no intimation as to the probable contents of the size of the message.

It was regarded as likely, however, that the message would deal with the international situation, and recommendations made for neutrality legislation. The present neutrality law expires January 29.

The public will wish her a serene and happy retirement-and hope that she will emerge from it now and then to let people hear her voice again.





Program Starts AUSTIN. (P).—More than \$1,000,-000 of state building construction will be put under contract by the board of control by the start of the new year, supplementing \$550,000 of work under way.

Opening of bids were scheduled or Dec. 14 to Jan. 3 on six jobs, the largest of which was a \$900,000 state building for the Centennial exposition at Dallas. The contract will be for general construction.
