BLOWING UP HORNBLOWERS

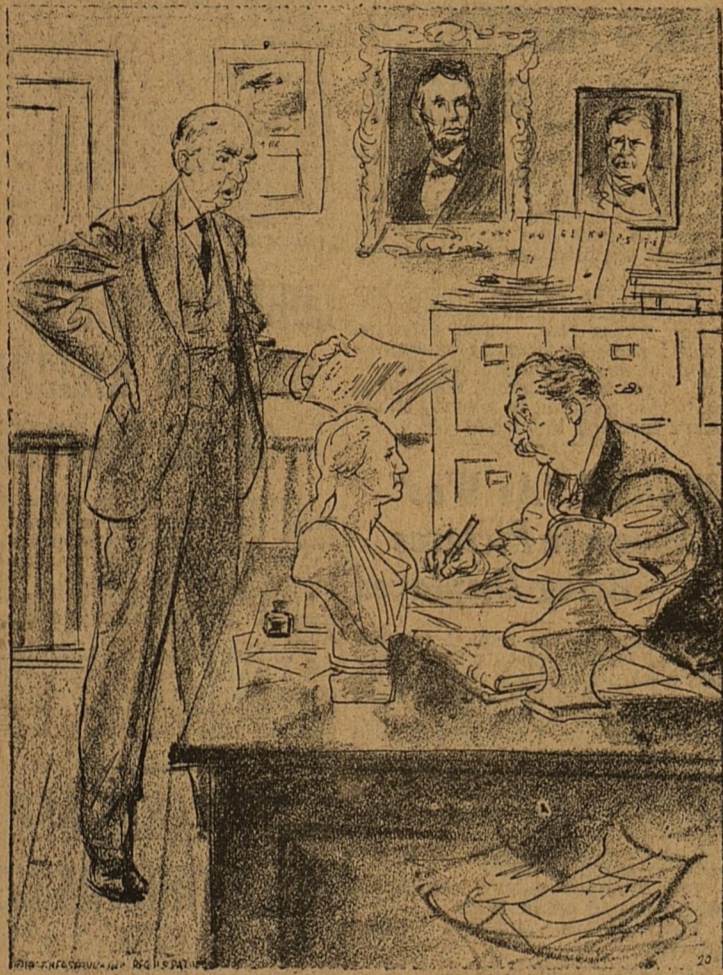

W. R. Manning, formerly assistant state chairman of Texas headquarters, San Antonio, Texas, and Guion Gregg, formerly district supervisor, headquarters, Lubbock, Texas.

The other divisional office will be given Judge W. L. Crittenden of Oklahoma City, embracing all of Oklahoma.

Gregg states that he is very much pleased because he will be permitted to remain in and have supervision over the western portion of the state where he has resided for many years.

The extension districts embraced in his sub-division are Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 10, comprising 97 counties and farm population of approximately 175,000 farms.

The duties of the "regional specialist" will be heavy because of his contact with the credit agencies throughout the state, the officials of Resettlement administration, the county committees appointed by the Governor, the district supervisors and the debt distressed farmers.

Gregg states that his assignments are not easy because results are not obtained along regular established business lines. Each debtor's case presented for adjustment is different, many of them embracing intricate legal questions, and all involving the conciliation and harmonizing of differences between creditors whose claims are long past due, more or less obstinate, and worthy debt burdened farmers, who are behind with their payments because of the adverse conditions that have prevailed.

Our great humanitarian President has often applauded the work that has been done in the past by our voluntary county committees and our state committees, who have acted as conciliators. These men are usually carefully selected because of their willingness to render a public service, and are named because of their knowledge of farm values, and their understanding of the correct relation between debtor

and creditor and their disposition of fairness. The recommendations of such men are not enforceable at law but are respected. And the committees have been successful in adjusting debt difficulties involved in an average of six out of ten cases presented, the others may have assumed the seriousness of legal procedure.

Those cases that assume the seriousness of foreclosure are referred to the conciliation commissioners. We never recommend resorting to legal process until all other means are exhausted and we only recommend the meeting of foreclosure with the Frazier-Lemke procedure after the creditor has drawn a legal sword and invited a legal battle.

All Resettlement offices formerly with headquarters in Austin are being moved now to Dallas, Texas. C. J. Crampton, executive secretary of the Dallas chamber of commerce, has provided suitable quarters for these offices in the Fidelity building and the Dallas Real Estate board has been active in providing home accommodations for more than three hundred families.
