Kidnaper Identified By An Attendant At Station

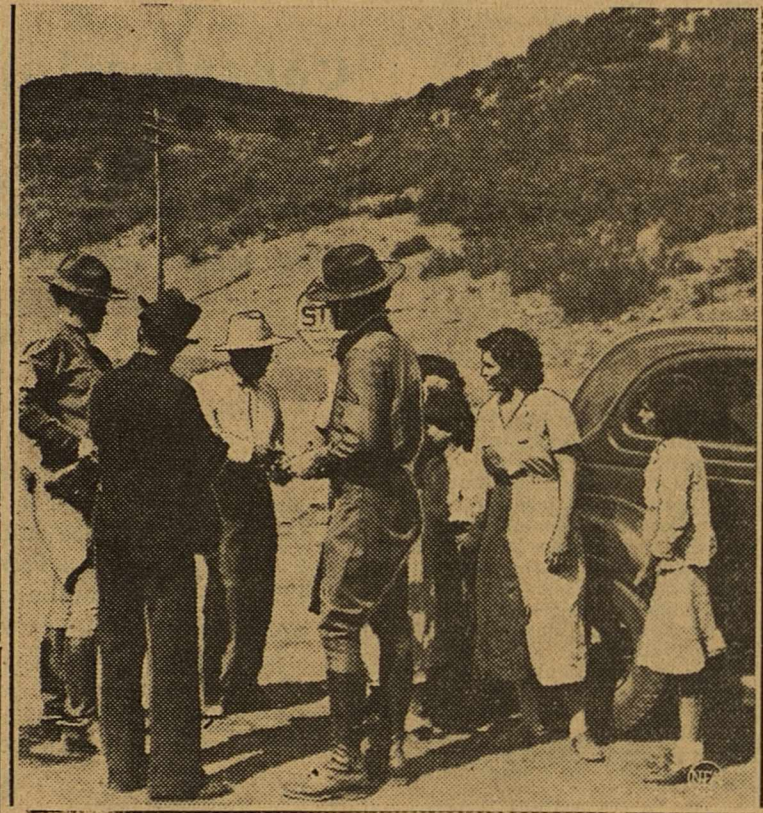

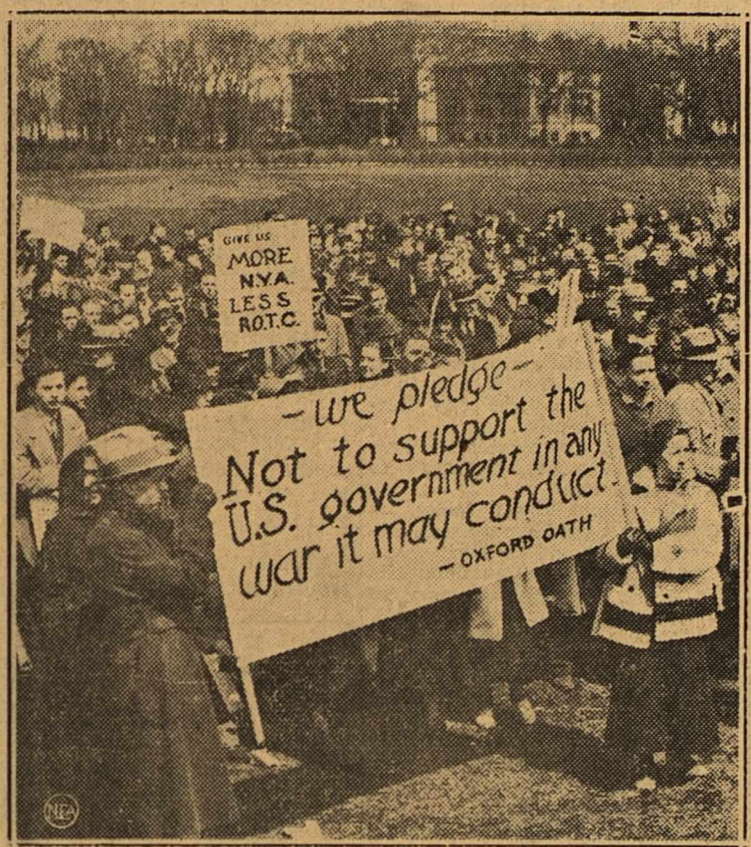
POLICE SEEKING JEWELS STOLEN FROM COUNTESS
